16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM

For 100 years, Zonta International has contributed to help achieve a world free of violence against women and girls through service and advocacy.

Violence against women and girls is one of the most pervasive human rights violations and a global epidemic. It knows no national or cultural barriers; it takes place at home, in the workplace and in open spaces, and affects millions of women and girls in peacetime and conflict.

Our ongoing **service** efforts are demonstrated through numerous local projects and programs, through the Zonta International Strategies to End Violence against Women (ZISVAW) program and through Zonta's partnerships with the United Nations and its agencies.

Our ongoing **advocacy** impact is built around the advocacy campaign "Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women." Launched in 2012, the campaign has raised awareness of the global pandemic of women's rights violations and has united Zonta clubs worldwide in conducting impactful advocacy actions to fight violence against women and gender inequality.

All Zonta clubs and districts are encouraged to take advocacy actions throughout the year:

- To promote the human rights of women
- To promote Sustainable Development Goal No. 5 "Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls"
- To end violence against women and girls

During the **16 Days of Activism, 25 November-10 December**, all Zonta clubs and districts are encouraged to take part in the Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women campaign and to take local, national and international actions to influence the making and implementation of laws, as well as changing gender-based attitudes and behaviors to end violence against women.

In 2019, the Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women campaign will focus on child marriage, one of the worst obstacles girls are facing globally and a severe human rights violation. Zonta clubs around the world are called upon to create awareness of this harmful practice among their members and the public.

Here are two key ways you can participate in the Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women campaign:

- Be a part of making our important message going viral. Each day, starting 24 November, Zonta International will release a new graphic that highlights important facts that illustrate the need to end child marriage. When you like, comment and share these original posts, the message of Zonta says NO to violence against women and child marriage will be seen as highly engaging content and will stay relevant on social news feeds. The longer the posts stay on the news feeds, the larger our audience will be throughout the campaign.
- Share how you are saying NO. Share with the rest of the world what your club, area and district are doing this campaign year to end child marriage through your local service and advocacy actions by filling out the **Share Your Story** form on zonta.org. These actions will be shared on zontasaysno.com and on our Twitter network.

64th Session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW64)

9-20 March 2020



Priority theme:

The main focus of the session will be a review of the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and the outcomes of the 23rd special session of the General Assembly. The review will include an assessment of current challenges that affect the implementation of the Platform for Action and the achievement of gender equality and the empowerment of women and its contribution towards the full realization of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

About the CSW

Of the 5,508 non-governmental organizations (NGOs) with consultative status at the United Nations, only 141 have General Consultative Status, the highest status an NGO can have at the UN. Zonta International was granted General Consultative Status in 1969.

As an **NGO with General Consultative Status**, Zonta International is invited to participate in the annual Commission on the Status of Women in New York. The Commission on the Status of Women is:

- A functional commission of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).
- The principal global intergovernmental body exclusively dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women.
- Established by resolution on 21 June 1946 to monitor and promote women's rights and develop global standards on gender equality and the empowerment of women; mandate expanded in 1996 to include monitoring and reviewing progress made in the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action.
