A Roadmap of How Zonta Club of Kauai Recruited 12 New Members Since July 2019

In July the fellowship Committee and Membership Chair met to plan a series of fellowship events for July and August. Before the July fellowship we met with potential members at a Hualani's restaurant on a Wednesday and invited about 2-3 potential members. We kept the subject of Zonta very minimum and mostly got to know the women and they got to know us.

Mid - July we planned a **themed "Wine & Water" pool party** at Incoming President, Lori Benkert's home with snacks, soda, & wine. We spoke briefly of Zonta's mission and invited guests to the August General Membership Meeting.

In August, we planned another **dinner at Duke's** for dinner and invited about 3 potential members to dinner. Spoke briefly about Zonta and **invited them to the September General membership meeting**. I think we meet during the week after work.

Please join me in congratulating Lucy Pei, 2019 Zonta International Women in Technology (WIT) Scholarship Recipient as well as recipient from District 9. Lucy's application was submitted by the Zonta Club of Newport Harbor. Lucy has been awarded \$8,000 on the International level and \$2,000 on the District level.



Lucy Pei is a 2nd year PhD in Informatics at University of California, Irvine (UCI) graduating in June 2024. Lucy's Undergraduate Degree and double major was Human Computer Interaction and Global Studies. In 2019 she received the Informatics Travel Fellowship and Resettlement Mentor working with refugees in FORGE.

Lucy has maintained a 4.0 Grade Average while working and volunteering. Her recommendation letters indicated that her Professors considered her in the top 5%!

Pei is pursuing the Informatics PhD program at Irvine's Donald Bren School of Information and Computer Sciences in hopes to become a professor in this field. She wants to contribute to theory and practice around how technologists engage with marginalized populations. Digital technology is increasingly deployed to address social issues encountered by marginalized groups such as low-income immigrants and resettled refugee communities.

Lucy states, "Through my goal of working as a research professor, I also hope to inspire and mentor university students to take action to contribute to positive social change."

Her ZIWIT Scholarship will support her doctoral research specifically conduct field research with local nonprofits serving immigrant and resettled refugee populations.

Lucy Pei is part of the first group of Women in Technology Scholars and the only USA International Recipient! Out of 32 Districts and Regions there were only 2 that did not apply. For the first cycle of a new scholarship that says Women in Technology Scholarship has a place along with our other educational initiatives.

Zontian Linda Weiland Receives HONOR in South Africa

Linda Weiland, a member of the Zonta Club of Leilehua in Hawaii, District 9, was honored at the "Women in Aerospace" Breakfast during the 2019 Annual Conference of the Aeronautical Society of South Africa, a division of the Royal Aeronautical Society.



Linda is an associate professor of Aeronautics in the College of Aeronautics at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and recently became the Assistant Program Chair of the Bachelor of Science in Aviation Maintenance degree. She developed the graduate Air Traffic Management (ATM) Specialization for the Masters in Aeronautical Science and was instrumental to the development of the ATM minor in the Bachelor of Science in Aeronautics. She also teaches many of the Master of Aviation Maintenance courses.

She serves on committees throughout the university and is on the editorial staff of aviation journals. She works with high schools and colleges around the world in Robotics, and STEM endeavors. Linda is the current Outreach Coordinator of the Women in Aviation International ERAU Worldwide Virtual Chapter and is active in several organizations including the Zonta Club of Leilehua.

Linda is currently a part-time PhD student at the University of the Witwatersrand in the school of Mechanical, Industrial and Aeronautical Engineering, Johannesburg, South Africa. Her topic of interest is Resilience of communication in ATM, with a focus on aeronautical and industrial engineering methodologies and theoretical framework.

Prior to fulltime employment at ERAU, she worked as a Liaison Engineer and Director of Project Management at a major airline. She is a decorated retired US Navy Lieutenant Commander with 26 years of service. She also spent ten years as an enlisted Air Traffic Controller, two years as a Manpower Specialist Officer in Aviation and 14 years as an Aircraft Maintenance Duty Officer. She has about 40 hours in the Backseat of the TA-4 and finished her Naval career forward deployed as a Maintenance Officer with FA-18s aboard the USS Kitty Hawk.

The Garden Island/Zonta Club Christmas Fund

Each year, it seems, Yoshiko "Dimples" Kano says it will be her last as the person spearheading The Garden Island/Zonta Club Christmas Fund. Each year, however, she returns. And this year is no different. The 94-year-old Dimples, while slowed by Father Time, keeps leading the charge, as she has been doing for two decades, to raise money to help those in need. "Having been there, not being able to afford anything, I know what it's like" she said. "Just the joy it brings to the people who don't expect anything. I think that's it — knowing that it really is Christmas for them. I'm told their faces light up." Marge Akana, Zonta Club of Kauai treasurer, will be assisting Dimples. "She's a go-getter," Akana said of her good friend. "You just can't keep her down." Akana, too, loves what the program means to so many facing hardships. "When you read the situations they're in, it just warms our hearts to be able to help them," she said. This holiday season, more than 700 requests for help from the Zonta Club Christmas Fund have come in from families and individuals. "We have received \$30,570 in donations to the Christmas Fund," Darrellyn Lemke, Zonta Club of Kauai Foundation Chair said. "That includes the \$5,000 donor match through the Hawaii Community Foundation. This is what makes it possible for the Zonta Club and its nine agency partners to make Christmas shine brighter for those who could use the help."

BETTER WORLD CAMPAIGN FY 20 SUMMARY.

FY 2020 Omnibus: Relevant to Zonta:

Congress released the text of its final Fiscal Year 2020 (FY 20) appropriations bill, the Omnibus.

With \$56.6 billion allocated for international affairs, the bill fully funds US contributions to the UN Regular Budget and core budgets of UN specialized agencies such as UNICEF, UNDP, UN Women and UN Human Rights Office.

The funding for International Organizations and Programs is \$26.5 million above the final FY19 level.

UNICEF, our partner, will receive \$139 million, an increase of \$1.5 million from FY19.

Unfortunately, funding for UNFPA will be reprogrammed to the Global Health Program.

Unlike previous years, there is \$1.5 million allocated to UN Special Coordinator on Preventing Sexual Exploitation and Abuse.
