Dear Family,

It is Day 4 of my self-quarantine. I have many things to be thankful for and several prayer requests.

- God has brought me back to WI just before travel began to close down.
- Two friends have graciously taken me into their home to spend these next 14 days.
- I have all I need and trusting God to bring me through this without getting COVID 19!
- My family is safe and healthy and taking their responsibility to isolate seriously.
- While leaving Myanmar I was able to spend deeper time with many good friends:
 - Pray for the Central Midwifery Director, Sayama Dashi Hkawnu who is home recovering from surgery secondary to her cancer. She looks great and is trusting God as her Healer!
 - Pray for Ma Eh and the nursing sisters she represents, may they be a voice to the healthcare world. Especially at this critical time.
 - Pray for the nation of Myanmar who has just gotten two confirmed cases of COVID 19!
 - Pray for May and James who are facing great financial loss in their apartment building bankruptcy, very difficult for them as they prepare to marry, but not too difficult for God!
 - Pray for Eh Wah, May and I as we begin our reading and homework for Year 2 of Trauma Counseling. Eh Wah has closed her pre-school and is ministering to children outside the city.
 - Pray for the graduates and students of the Bible Schools of Myanmar. May they be safe and used by the Lord in this time of serious need.
 - Pray for Bettina, my first coworker. She has relocated to Hmawbi to help with a bible school.
 - Pray for Dr. Aung Mang, just returning to Myanmar after stopping treatment for gastric cancer. He is now in isolation. Please pray he tests negative for COVID 19 and is able to be cared for by his family. He is seriously ill, but not too critical for God!
 - Pray also for our Team. Most are in Yangon (Joyce, Callahans, and Grahams), two are up-country (Tim, and Gloria); the rest of us are itinerating (Schulers, Sullivans and myself.) We all need sensitivity and direction to be of our best use to God at this time. (Hayes are now church-based in AZ.)
