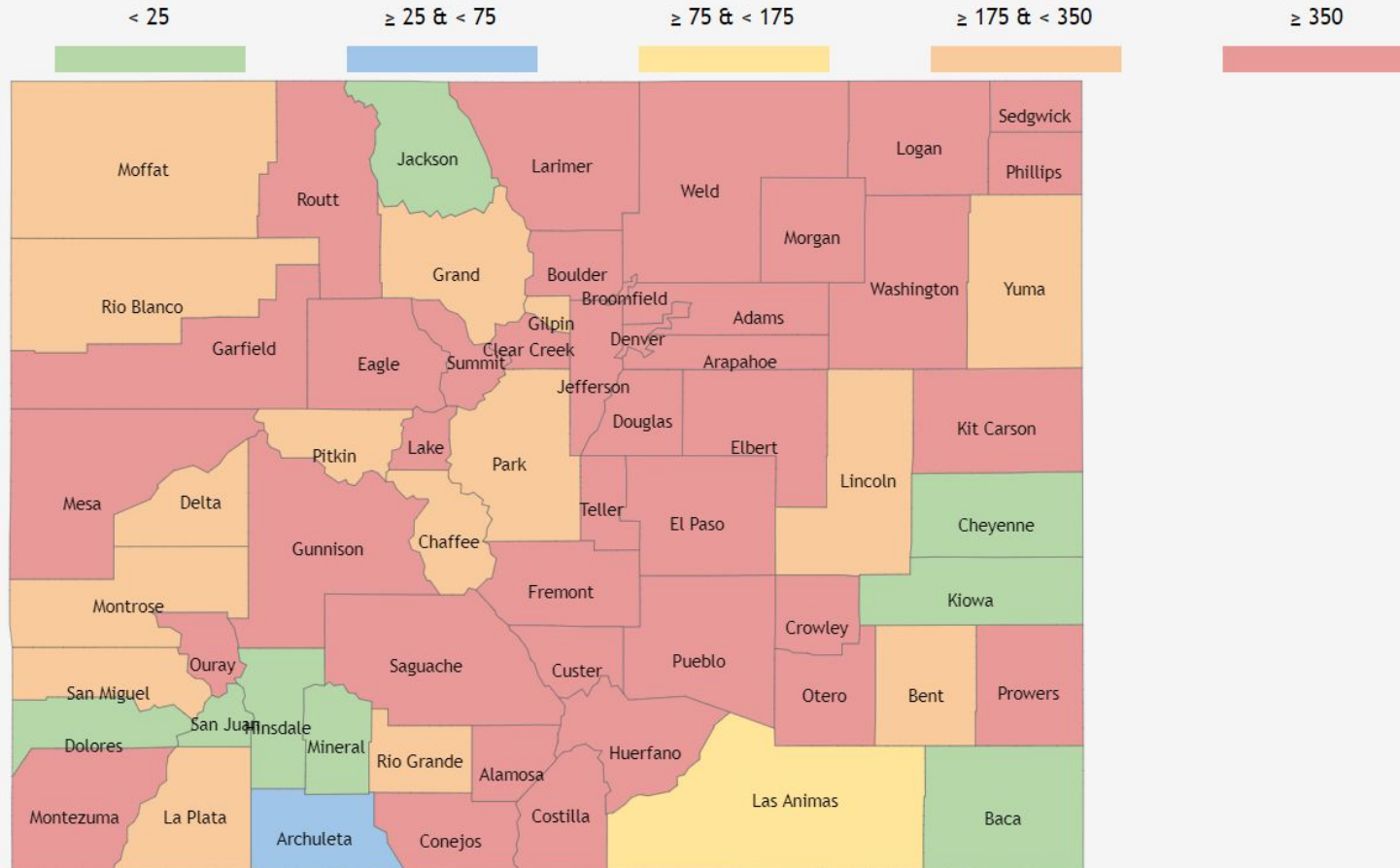

Click a County to View Corresponding Dial & Metrics

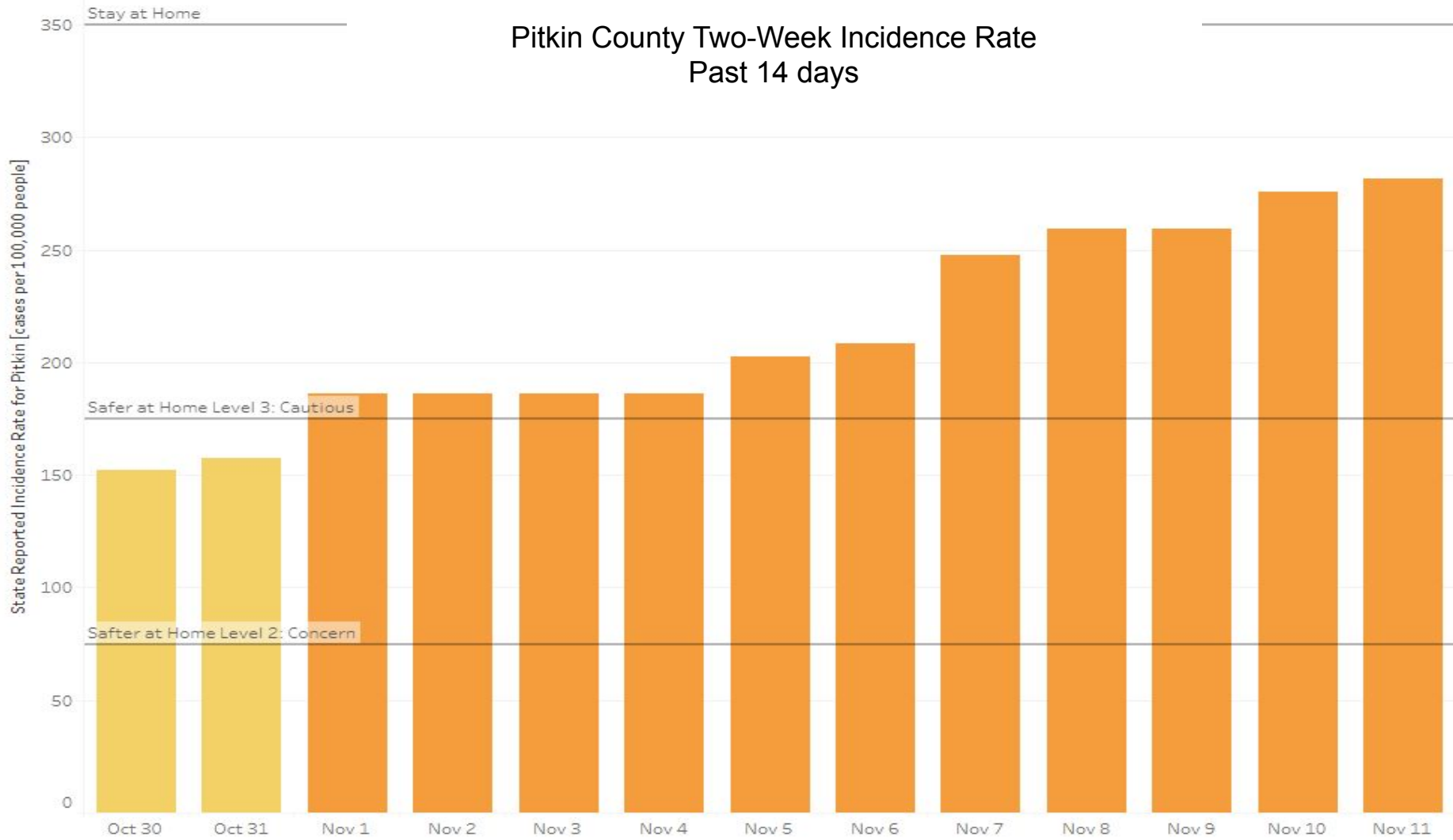

Pitkin County Two-Week Incidence Rate Past 14 days



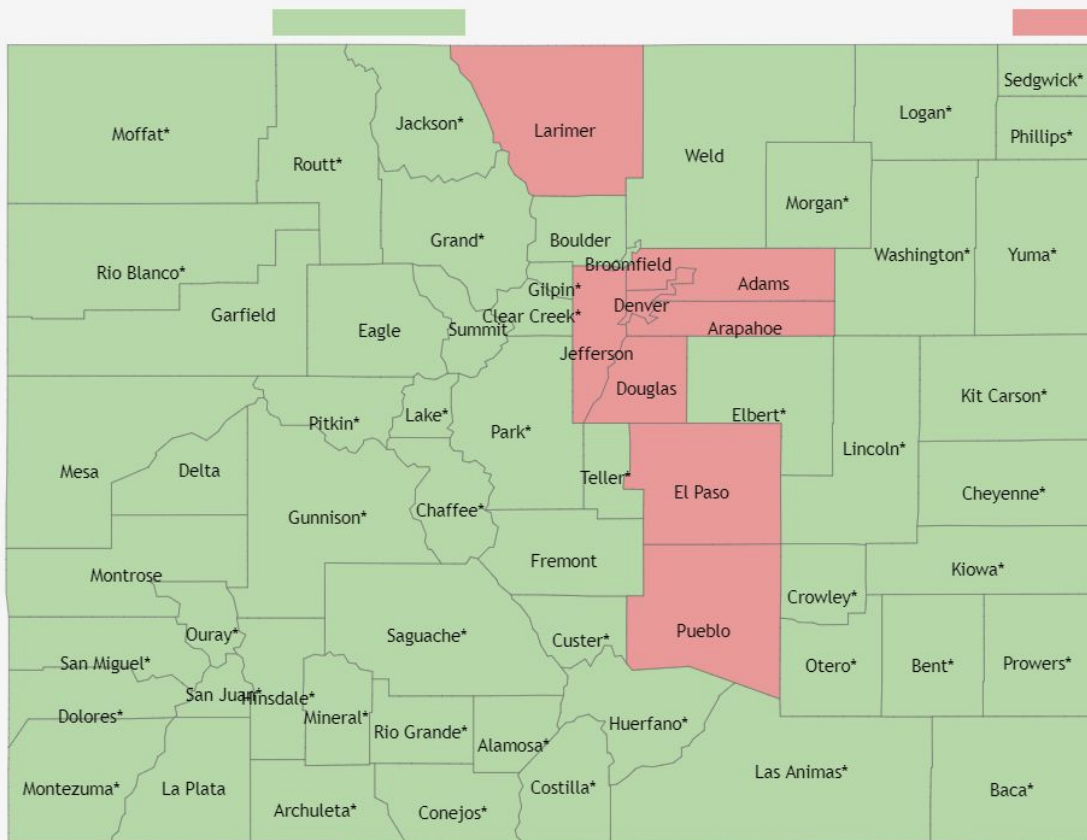
Number of Days with Decreasing or Stable Hospital Admissions

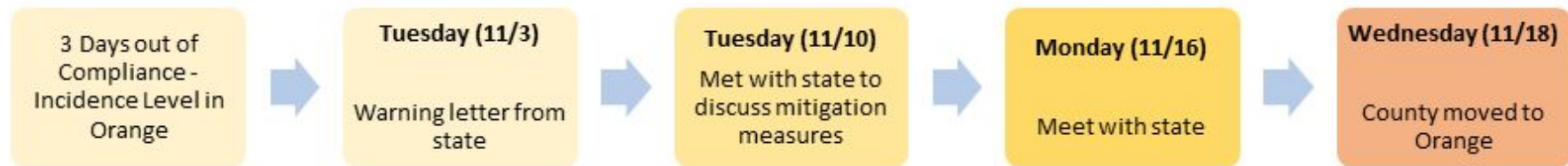
8-14 Days

For counties with a population of 30,000 or less, if there have been three or more new hospital admissions in any of the last 14 days, that county's hospitalization measure is assigned to "red". Otherwise, counties' hospitalization measures are assigned to "green".

P-12 Schools

In-person, hybrid, or remote as appropriate



Higher Education

Remote or hybrid suggested, limited in-person as appropriate



Places of Worship

INDOORS: Unseated: 25%, 50 people with calculator
Seated: 25%, 50 people
OUTDOORS: 6ft between parties per local zoning



Group Sports

Virtual, or outdoors in groups less than 10



Retail

25% capacity



Personal Services

25% capacity or 25 people



Restaurants

INDOORS: 25% capacity, 50 people
OUTDOORS: 6ft between parties outdoors, per local zoning



Offices

25% capacity



Bars

Closed



Gyms/Fitness

25% capacity, 25 indoors, or outdoors in groups less than 10



Indoor Events

Unseated: 25%, 50 people with calculator
Seated: 25%, 50 people with 6ft distancing



Outdoor Events

Unseated: 25%, 75 people (with calculator)
Seated: 25%, 75 people with 6ft distancing



Outdoor Guided Services

25% capacity or 10 people

Changes to Business Safety Plan

- Reflects alignment with the State Public Health Order and Sector-Specific Guidance
- Capacities for each dial level and sector-specific guidance addressed to help businesses adhere to the current level restrictions
- Prevents the need for updating or re-submitting a plan based on changes in the dial
- Anticipated to go live no later than Monday, November 16th.
- Community Liaison & Consumer Protection teams will be reaching out requesting submission of a new Business Safety Plan



Business Safety Plan

Businesses required to have a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan Checklist on file per the Pitkin County Public Health Order, shall implement all measures listed below, and be prepared to explain why any measure that is not implemented does not apply to the business. A PDF version of this form (which constitutes as your safety plan), along with the Compliance Poster will be emailed to you after submission. Please ensure your email address has been typed in correctly. No other approval is required.

Mitigation Measures

- Follow the Five Commitments of Containment
- Interact with only those in your household - do your best to avoid any social interactions with friends and family outside of your homes throughout the month of November
- Don't go to work sick- employers can stress the importance of symptom checks and encourage those with symptoms to [get tested](#). Employers should also consider allowing employees to work from home when feasible, discouraging carpooling, and preventing employees from gathering in indoor spaces like break rooms.
- Work from home if possible
- Avoid carpooling with others not of the same household.
