Hi Team,

Just a quick update from Washington, D.C.—

This week, I had the opportunity to meet with the Bureau of Reclamation to discuss their federal grant programs. The agency expressed optimism about the future of their funding initiatives and was enthusiastic about the upcoming release of several new opportunities, including additional rounds of their WaterSMART grants. It's encouraging to see their commitment to supporting local governments and water agencies through these crucial programs.

I am happy to report that the following federally funded programs are currently available:

USDOJ: COPS Hiring Program (CHP)

Deadline: Grants.gov – June 25, 2025 | JustGrants – July 1, 2025

Amount: Up to \$125,000

Match: 25% local cash match

Provides funding to law enforcement agencies to hire and/or rehire additional career law enforcement officers to increase community policing capacity and support crime prevention efforts.

California Department of Parks and Recreation: Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF)

Deadline: August 5, 2025

Amount: Up to \$6 million

Provides up to \$6 million in funding for the acquisition or development of public outdoor recreation areas and facilities.

Cal Parks: Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program (ORLP)

Deadline: TBD Winter 2026

Amount: \$300,000 to \$15 million per application

Funds urban park and recreation projects in underserved communities.

USDOT: Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A)

Deadline: June 26, 2025

Amount: \$100,000 to \$25 million

Match: 20%

Supports local roadway safety plans and implementation projects.

USDOT FHA: Bridge Investment Program

Deadlines:

- August 1, 2025 for Large Bridge Projects (minimum \$2.5M)
- October 1, 2025 for Planning Grants (FY '26 funding)
- November 1, 2025 for Bridge Projects (minimum \$50M)

Amount: \$2.5 million to \$100 million

Provides funding to rehabilitate or replace aging infrastructure and reduce the number of bridges in poor condition.
