



City of Nevada City receives \$323,135 for Caltrans Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant

Nevada City, CA—Nevada City has been awarded a \$323,135 grant from Caltrans to develop a citywide Active Transportation Master Plan, officials announced this week. Project Manager Karen Leventhal worked alongside municipal leadership to craft the winning proposal

This plan will:

- Map high-injury pedestrian corridors and close sidewalk gaps near schools and senior centers.
- Design low-stress bikeways linking downtown with residential ridgelines and regional trails.
- Align proposed projects with countywide greenhouse-gas-reduction targets and forthcoming recreation strategies.

“We’re excited to lead this shift toward more equitable and sustainable transportation options,” said City Manager Sean Grayson. “This grant will help us create a vision that not only connects Nevada City, but also promotes the health and safety of residents, visitors, and workers alike.”

By laying the groundwork now, Nevada City is taking a decisive step toward building a safer, greener, and more connected community for generations to come.
