California Apprenticeship Initiative New and Innovative Grant Program FY 2023-24

Deadline: January 15, 2024

Create or bolster apprenticeship opportunities in priority and emerging industry sectors or areas in which apprenticeship training is not fully established or does not exist. Planning, Implementation and Expansion grants.

California State Library: California Civil Liberties Public Education Program

Deadline: January 15, 2024

Amount: Maximum for statewide project: \$125,000; Maximum for community projects: \$50,000

Match: Not required, but encouraged. Applicants are encouraged to seek additional investment in their project – ideally a dollar-for-dollar (1:1) match, if possible and applicable. The match may be from corporate contributions, private contributions, local government, earned income or in-kind matches, including labor from experts, volunteers, administrators, and others. Matches are strongly encouraged but not required.

Eligibility: Nonprofits, units of local government

Summary: The Program funds projects that educate Californians about the Japanese American experience during World War II often in conjunction with parallel civil rights violations or civil liberties injustices. The program is funded by the State of California. Past projects have included films; books and

live readings; photo collections and exhibits; visual art exhibits; museum displays; arts performances of drama, dance, and music; oral histories; document and material preservation; educational guides and curriculum; website tools; essay and literature projects; public art and monuments; and music and recordings. Applicants should have experience, knowledge, and qualifications to conduct quality educational activities regarding the exclusion and detention of Japanese Americans during World War II or at least one community partnership with these characteristics in place before submitting an application.

EPA: Clean School Bus Rebate Program

Deadline: January 31st, 2024

Amount: A CSB rebate is a payment from EPA to an eligible entity to subsidize the purchase of one or more ZE or clean school buses, and eligible infrastructure, that meet the requirements described in this Program Guide. Importantly, rebates allow selectees to receive awarded funds before purchasing the eligible buses, infrastructure, and other expenses listed in their rebate application; however, buses and associated infrastructure must be purchased after notification of a rebate award. Fleets are also required to replace existing buses by the end of the project period, although there can be overlap between receiving replacement buses and replacing existing buses.

California Community Schools Partnership Program (CCSPP)

Deadline: February 9, 2024

Amount: Up to \$500,000 per campus per year

Duration: 5 years

Matching requirements: At least one-third of total grant amount

Reporting requirements: Annual

Purpose: to fund transformation of campuses into community schools, including funding initiatives around four evidence-informed programmatic features, captured in state law, which are aligned and integrated into high-quality, rigorous teaching and learning practices and environments:

- Integrated support services;
- Family and community engagement;
- Collaborative leadership and shared decision-making; and
- Extended/expanded learning time and opportunities.

California State Library: Community Impact Grants

Deadline: March 6, 2024, at noon

Amount: \$10,000 to \$100,000

Eligibility: Libraries. Libraries with up to 14 outlets may apply for one local grant; libraries with between 15 and 30 outlets may apply for two local grants; libraries with 31 or more outlets may apply for three local grants.

Summary: Community Impact Grants (formerly known as “Local and Collaborative Grants”) help library workers respond effectively to local needs and align services with community aspirations. This program supports experimentation and research and development in California’s libraries. To receive funding, applicants must demonstrate attention to equity in their planning and implementation through existing and planned community partnerships, intentional connections made with marginalized communities, and the integration of equity principles and practices.

California State Library: Play for All

Deadline: March 6, 2024, at noon

Amount: \$10,000 to \$75,000

Eligibility: Libraries

Summary: The Play for All funding opportunity provides grants to help California libraries design and create welcoming family play spaces and offer meaningful programming around play for marginalized young children. The purpose of these grants is to support libraries in addressing the barriers and inequitable access to quality play spaces and play-based programming young children may experience in marginalized, under-resourced, and underserved communities.

California libraries can apply for grant funding to support:

- Staff time to co-design, coordinate, and implement play-based programs.
- Purchases of mobile and/or child-friendly furnishings, manipulatives, and materials to create play spaces for young children.
- Services from community organizations including parenting workshops and presentations about play-based child development.
- Participation in professional development workshops to gain knowledge and skills around play-based programming and spaces.
- Outreach and promotion of play resources and programs.
- Any additional allowable expenditures that help libraries provide young children access to play. Please note that if grant funds will be used to pay for a service from a community organization or organizations, those organization(s) cannot be considered as a partner in the application.

California State Library: Sustainable California Libraries

Deadline: March 6, 2024, at noon

Amount: \$10,000 to \$75,000

Eligibility: Libraries

Summary: The Sustainable California Libraries grant program funds climate and sustainability related community-driven programming for adults and intergenerational groups. The initiative also fosters connections between California library workers supporting climate resilience in communities. The purpose of these grants is to fund services, programming, and educational opportunities focused on sustainability and climate resilience.

California State Library: Teens Succeed

Deadline: March 6, 2024, at noon

Amount: \$50,000 to \$75,000

Eligibility: Libraries

Summary: The Teens Succeed opportunity provides grant funding for teen internships, with a focus on developing social emotional and workforce readiness skills. The purpose of this grant is to address the challenges teens face in the aftereffects of the pandemic and to help prepare youth for success in life.

California State Library: eBooks for All

Deadline: March 6, 2024, at noon

Amount: The collection, currently consisting of over 150,000 copies of over 90,000 titles, is designed to meet the recreational and informational reading needs of California's diverse communities. Many titles are licensed for simultaneous use. The collection is available to all public libraries to provide for free to readers of all ages. Libraries wishing to have access to this collection must be on the Palace App, an eReader aggregator that can browse and display materials from Overdrive, CloudLibrary, and other similar services.

Match: Yes - 25%

Eligibility: In order to participate in this opportunity, libraries must join the eBooks for All project and offer access to Palace to their patrons. If your library has not yet joined and you are interested in participating, please email ebooksforall@library.ca.gov to get started.

Amount: The maximum amount of funding will be based on the number of enrolled homeless children and youth as reported on the 2022-23 Cumulative DataQuest reports. Max funding amounts: 50-99 / \$15,000; 100-249 / \$25,000; 250-499 / \$50,000; 500-1,499 / \$75,000; 1,500-2,499 / \$100,000; 2,500-3,999 / \$125,000; 4,000-4,999 / \$175,000; Over 5,000 / \$250,000

Services provided cannot replace the regular academic program and must be designed to expand or improve services that are part of the school's regular academic program.

CalSHAPE Plumbing and CalSHAPE Ventilation

The California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency Program (CalSHAPE) provides funding to upgrade heating, air conditioning, and ventilation (HVAC) systems in public schools and replaces noncompliant plumbing fixtures and appliances that fail to meet water efficiency standards.

Dollar General Literacy Foundation: Beyond Words

Deadline: Ongoing

Amount: Not specified

Eligibility: Pre-K-12 public schools whose library programs have incurred substantial damage or hardship due to a natural disaster, fire, or an act of terrorism within the past three years.

Summary: Beyond Words, a program of the Dollar General Literacy Foundation, supports public school libraries in the communities served by Dollar General. Grants are intended to help replace or supplement books, media, and library equipment.

KaBOOM!: Build it with KaBOOM!

Deadline: Continuous

Amount: \$15,000 - Grantees are awarded a \$15,000 grant to be used toward the purchase of playground equipment. To supplement the \$15,000 KaBOOM! grant, grantees are required to raise a

minimum of \$9,000 (for a total project value of \$24,000) up to a maximum of \$35,000 (for a total project value of \$50,000) towards the cost of the playground project. This amount does not include the cost for safety surfacing, freight, site preparation, installation supervision and any other non-playground equipment items.

Match: \$9,000

Eligibility: Must be located in San Jose, Los Angeles County, San Francisco, Brisbane, San Bernardino, Anaheim, Oakland or Santa Ana (See other qualified Community Partner requirements)

Summary: The USA Football Grant Program enables youth, middle school, and high school programs to upgrade equipment, improve playing fields, and acquire life-saving equipment. Applications for equipment, field and product grants are available each year.

Learning Communities for School Success Program

Deadline: TBD

Amount: Approved LEAs will receive \$50 per 2020-21 enrolled student for each year of the three-year grant. Minimum three-year grants for LEAs with 100 or less enrollment will be \$15,000. Maximum LEA grants will be \$2,000,000 for three-year grant period. This Award is made contingent upon the availability of funds.

Match: Yes

Eligibility: All LEAs, which includes school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools, are eligible to apply. LEAs with a high rate (exceeding the state average) of chronic absenteeism, dropout, and out-of-school suspension will be given priority, as well as those with a significant representation of foster youth or in a community with a high crime rate.

Purpose: The Learning Communities for School Success Program (LCSSP) provides funds to local education agencies (LEAs) to support programs aimed at improving student outcomes by reducing truancy and supporting students who are at risk of dropping out of school or are victims of crime. The LCSSP is the result of Proposition 47, which reduced the penalties for certain non-serious, non-violent offenses and allocates 25% of the resulting statewide savings for LEA grants.

U.S. Dept. of Energy Renew America's Schools Round 2

The Renew America's Schools grant is the program's flagship funding opportunity. This competitive award focuses on funding infrastructure upgrades at K–12 public school facilities, prioritizing high-need school communities. The first round of this Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) launched in November 2022. After unprecedented public interest, the application period closed on April 21, 2023.

FY22-23 Urban and Community Forestry Green Schoolyards

Deadline: Spring 2024

Amount: Between \$200,000 and \$6,000,000 awarded per application including no more than \$1,000,000 per child care facility

Match: encouraged 25% of the project budget

Eligibility: Nonprofit, Public Agency, Cities, Counties, Qualifying School Districts, and Non-profit Organizations.

These funds allow school food authorities (SFA) to purchase food service equipment to serve healthier meals that meet the meal pattern requirements, replace outdated or worn equipment, improve procurement of goods, improve food safety, improve the lunchroom to be more appealing to the students, help support the maintenance of an existing kitchen or the establishment of a new school kitchen or School Nutrition Program. It gives priority to those SFAs that have not received an equipment grant since 2019.

FY 2023 Virtual Reality Training Development for Law Enforcement

Eligibility: Public and state controlled institutions of higher education

With this solicitation, the Bureau of Justice Assistance seeks to support a collaborative partnership between two or more universities to develop, design, and pilot a virtual reality training program designed to improve law enforcement interactions with all individuals, with an emphasis on de-escalation tactics. New technologies, including virtual reality systems designed for use by police, allow for multiparticipant engagement and can be integrated into training programs focused on improving law enforcement encounters. Universities are required to partner to carry out the activities of the federal award; however only one applicant can apply.
