

A service of Evening Prayer with Taizé music

Officiant: As we begin worship, we acknowledge the traditional peoples of the land on which we stand: the Yavapai Apache, Hopi, Navajo, and Ancient Peoples. We pay our respects to them for their care of the land.

Gathering Song 'In the Lord rejoicing' *Songs & Prayers from Taizé #23*
In the Lord rejoicing! Christ is risen from the dead! Alleluia!

Officiant: Let us pray the Psalm responsively by half verse.

Psalm 33

¹ Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous; *
it is good for the just to sing praises.

¹³ The Lord looks down from heaven, *
and beholds all the people in the world.

² Praise the Lord with the harp; *
play to him upon the psaltery and lyre.

¹⁴ From where he sits enthroned he turns his gaze *
on all who dwell on the earth.

³ Sing for him a new song; *
sound a fanfare with all your skill upon the trumpet.

¹⁵ He fashions all the hearts of them *
and understands all their works.

⁴ For the word of the Lord is right, *
and all his works are sure.

¹⁶ There is no king that can be saved by a mighty army; *
a strong man is not delivered by his great strength.

⁵ He loves righteousness and justice; *
the loving-kindness of the Lord fills the whole earth.

¹⁷ The horse is a vain hope for deliverance; *
for all its strength it cannot save.

⁶ By the word of the Lord were the heavens made, *
by the breath of his mouth all the heavenly hosts.

¹⁸ Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon
those who fear him, *
on those who wait upon his love,

⁷ He gathers up the waters of the ocean as in a
water-skin *
and stores up the depths of the sea.

¹⁹ To pluck their lives from death, *
and to feed them in time of famine.

⁸ Let all the earth fear the Lord; *
let all who dwell in the world stand in awe of him.

²⁰ Our soul waits for the Lord; *
he is our help and our shield.

⁹ For he spoke, and it came to pass; *
he commanded, and it stood fast.

²¹ Indeed, our heart rejoices in him, *
for in his holy Name we put our trust.

¹⁰ The Lord brings the will of
the nations to naught; *
he thwarts the designs of the peoples.

²² Let your loving-kindness, O Lord, be upon us, *
as we have put our trust in you.

¹¹ But the Lord's will stands fast for ever, *
and the designs of his heart from age to age.

**Glory to the Father, and to the Son,
and to the Holy Spirit:
as it was in the beginning, is now,
and will be for ever. Amen.**

¹² Happy is the nation whose God is the Lord! *
happy the people he has chosen to be his own!

Lector: A reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax-collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax-collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income." But the tax-collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted.'

Lector: Here ends the Reading.

Let us pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name,
thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

Let us bless the Lord.


