

Teachers and school support staff are among the people who now qualify to receive a COVID booster. COVID boosters are recommended for people who are over 65 yrs of age and for those who are immunocompromised. Boosters are also available to those, aged 18 to 64 years old, who work in a high risk environment, including schools, and who completed their initial COVID vaccines at least 6 months ago.

There are lots of great opportunities for any school staff member who finished their initial vaccine series at least six months ago and wants to get a booster and also for anyone who is still unvaccinated and wants to be protected. The CDC and the FDA have now approved "mixing and matching" vaccines for the booster. That means that no matter which type of vaccine you had for your initial series, you can choose Pfizer or Moderna for your booster. If you got J & J for your initial vaccine, it is recommended that you get Pfizer or Moderna for a booster.
