Destination: ELA

Readings of the season have been used to work on comprehension skills in both fiction and nonfiction. We have been working on going back into the text to cite evidence. The children will be reading about Ecosystems as a cross curricular activity with Science. This will give us foundation for our next novel, *Poppy*. Please plan on having your child's copy of *Poppy* in school by January 7 so we can begin our reading.

Destination: Math

We have been working with numeric and nonnumeric patterns; the children have picked these up quickly. Moving to input/output boxes have posed a challenge but with practice they are understanding the overall concept and are doing well with practice. While we are practicing our division, along with the input/output boxes; I gave them challenge work with ordered pairs, which they did an amazing job with; I am very proud of them and the way they dig right into any challenge I offer them!

Destination: Religion

While we enter this last week of Advent; the children have done a wonderful job keeping Christ in Christmas and observing Advent. In the upcoming week we will be spending more time sharing the story of Jesus' birth. We will also be working on more acts of holiday kindness. Finally, we will share our presentations on our Family Christmas Traditions.
