This joy lasted for the rest of the day and as he did his work, he eagerly shared with his friends that Jesus and the Holy Spirit were helping him! He continued to speak about it while they were waiting for dismissal and he said he was going to pray and ask Jesus and the Holy Spirit each time he had a problem! Thank you Mrs. Heyder and second grade for sending us forward with a most important and comforting lesson!

As we continue counting our school days; we are also counting the blessings in each of those days and you can see that in the little things we find great lessons and comfort! We are nearing October and we have counted 16 school days! So mid-November will get us to the 50th day of school! Last year some of the older students, after dressing in 50's attire, asked if we could have 60's, 70's, 80's and 90's days.
