


4B Flight Update for the Week of January 25, 2019

It is a jam packed week and we want to keep the momentum of third quarter going! With the community building assemblies and other planned activities, we will have a slight mixed up schedule; but our crew is always ready to work and cooperate! The only assessments I am planning in the upcoming week is a Spelling Test, and a Science Quiz on Friday. Please note that Wednesday is a no homework day as part of student appreciation day! This might be a good evening to share an extra treat of fun family activity and mark the halfway point of our journey; and all the progress our crew has made so far this year!

This past week, despite it being short, we accomplished many great tasks, and one sad (we finished our novel, they wanted the story to keep going). The children did a wonderful job presenting their animals in our cross-curricular reading and science activity; and this week worked together to build a habitat for their animals; we also spent time writing about the features of our habitat and how it supported the life of our animal. We will present these, next week. Our station rotation is going well and the children are getting more responsibility as the weeks go by; our biggest challenge on some of the stations is time management, which is a skill we continue to improve. We had a number of quizzes to kick off new topics for the third quarter and we are showing improvement in slowing down, checking our work and reasonableness of our answers, as well as improving on our reader responses. Going forward we will be having a separate math vocabulary quiz for each new topic; we will also be adding keywords from past units as a refresher.

We will work on moving forward with our current math unit on fractions, practicing our spelling words (we will add to the new words to our current list), we will be working with fifth grade to learn more about Invention Convention, and in reading, the class will wrap up with several comprehension activities related to *Poppy*; I know they are sad our novel has ended. We will still start *Number the Stars* on February 20, when we return from Winter Break. The next few weeks ahead and to rotate with our novel reading in February and March, we will be working with other books in our Literature Circles. Each member of a group has a specific role and together they work on different comprehension skills, vocabulary, reading, and discussions.

In social studies and writing with Mrs. Damalas; we have started doing research and gathering information for our next writing piece. We will soon be putting all this information about our State all together in our essay. We are reading and learning about the manufacturing, industry and business in our book while working and doing research for our State Project. More information will follow on this project and what is required. In Grammar, we will work on verbs. Please ask your student and check on Rediker for test date.
