



NEW TRAVEL ADVISORY

Dear Parents,

As we enter the February winter break and the upcoming April vacation, I wanted to share the current travel advisory. As parents, we want you to understand the return to school expectations related to our response to vacation travel.

There are several essential points in this new advisory:

1. It applies to all domestic travel that is 24 hours or longer except for travel to NY, NJ, and RI.
2. The quarantine is now 10 days long.
3. Individuals may continue to test out of travel quarantine.
4. All tests - except for COVID-19 antibody tests - may be used.
5. Testing may happen 72 hours before leaving the travel destination or upon arrival in CT.
6. All test results and other documentation must still be submitted to the state.
7. Please notify the nurse of the test results if you plan to test out.

For additional guidance on **international travel**, visit the [COVID-19 Travel Recommendations](#) section of the CDC's website. The quarantine recommendations may differ from the CT DPH's depending on the country's Covid-19 level.

Through our collaborative efforts to follow the travel advisory recommendations and the implementation of health safety protocols and mitigation strategies, including social distancing and the use of masks, we will minimize risks to our students, parents, and staff.
