


Dear St. Rose Families,

Gratitude from All!:


We can't say thank you enough for all the outpouring of generosity to our classrooms to provide cleaning supplies and recess items!

Here's Will, a very excited 4th grader, delivering 30 recess bags to Mrs. Russo; one for each of his classmates!






Art from the cart in grade 3!
