### The Week in Review

#### Language and Literacy:

This past week, we were able to play some simple games to work on letter-sound association. The children heard the story Little Red Hen and they were instructed to have to be able to recall parts of the story, and they couldn't share the same idea as the person sitting next to them. We explored what happened in the beginning, middle and end. We also talked about the characters. I was amazed on how much the children were able to

retain the story and then later share it.

We are building on our winter word wall. The children are really getting excited to be able to sound out the words when the pictures are removed.

Math/Science:

The children are beginning to recognize and verbalize personal information. This includes knowing his/her address, telephone number, and birthdays. This is important for many reasons. Please assist me by discussing this information at home and helping your children learn these important Kindergarten readiness & personal awareness skills.

Religion:

We are beginning our unit on St. Valentine. The children have been involved in a few Valentine surprises.

Another activity that I incorporated into our daily morning circle-time: reading simple bible stories to the children. I love when they ask questions and point out things that I normally wouldn't think of. For example; the other day we were chatting about how God asked one thing of Adam and Eve, and that was not to eat the fruit on the tree. When we got to the point where the serpent slithered into the garden and was able to convince Adam and Eve that it was ok to eat it. One of the children said, "I know how the snake did that, he made himself look beautiful and colorful like God, so they thought it was ok to eat it". (Have I told you all how much I absolutely love my job!)
