


DIRECTIONS to the M.A.S. OBSERVING SITE at BURTON'S SUGAR FARM  
9714 Highway 72 Near MICHIGAN CITY, MISSISSIPPI

Allow about 55 minutes from Bartlett.

- 1a. Go east on Poplar into Collierville, past Houston Levee and Byhalia Rd. Bear right onto US 72 E.
- 1b. Go south on Houston Levee Rd. to Poplar, turn left, go past Byhalia Rd., and bear right onto US 72 E.  
Or, continue south on Houston Levee to TN 385, go east, take US 72 E (Corinth) exit.
- 1c. Take TN 385 / I-269 around the SE perimeter. Stay on 269 when 385 splits off. Take US 72 exit (E).
2. Continue east on US 72 to the Mississippi state line. Set odometer to 0.0.
3. Pass MS 302 (4.3), MS 311 (6.3), Slayden (10.2), Benton County line (15.6), and MS 7 (18.7). Refer to map below.



4. Keep going east on US 72 past MS 7 (18.7), and cross the Mississippi Central RR (19.1). You can reset odometer to 0.0 at the RR. On the right, just past the railroad, is a concrete statuary store (19.2).
5. 3.2 miles to go. Cross Meridian Rd. (a.k.a. Harris Chapel Rd.) at 21.5 (2.4 from RR).
6. 0.8 mile to go. Pass one cut-through; turn right at the second one, into Burton's Sugar Farm (22.3, 3.2 from RR). Coordinates 34.9463, -89.2327. Look for the white fence and metal gate, back from the road. If you get to Thomas Rd. (22.6, 3.5), MS 5, or the Wolf River, you have gone too far.
7. The big barn is on the right. Sometimes we observe behind or beside it (34.9441, -89.2330), other times we keep going past it another 0.2 mile to the cabin (about 1/3 mile from the highway), also on the right (34.9417, -89.2327).

**M.A.S. OBSERVING SITE REGULATIONS**  
**November 2015**

1. No smoking in the observing area, within 150 feet of the telescopes.
2. No use of firearms on the premises.
3. No drinking of alcoholic beverages in the observing area.
4. An adult member of the Society must be present at all observing sessions. An adult supervisor will have the authority to conduct the session in the best interest of all attending.
5. Parking is permitted only in designated areas. If you arrive after the scheduled beginning of the observing session, turn off your headlights or park at least 150 feet away from the telescopes.
6. No flashlights permitted without a red filter within 150 feet of the telescopes.
7. Cellular telephones may not be used in the observing area unless they are dimmed and/or equipped with a red filter.
8. If children are present, they must not be permitted to run in the observing area.
9. Each person must remove his own trash from the premises.
10. Members and visitors attending observing sessions and using the site do so at their own risk.
