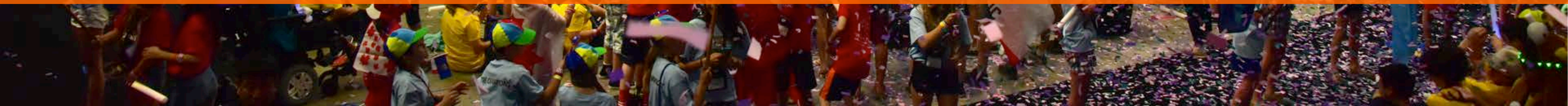

Why do kids like Destination Imagination ?

- DI is a **COMPETITION** in which students form teams, select a challenge and present their solution at the South Metro tournament in March.
- Teams select one Team Challenge to solve their own way and present at tournament... and **NO** parent, teacher or Team Manager **INTERFERENCE** is allowed!
- The top three teams in each level of each competitive challenges **take home medals** and **advance to the state competition** held on the Auraria Campus in April.
- The top three teams at the state competition **take home more medals** in each level of each competitive challenges and **advance to the Global Finals Tournament** in Knoxville TN!

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Why do Parents like Destination Imagination?

- Destination Imagination prepares kids to be the innovators of the future by combining the arts, sciences and technology with creativity and problem solving.
- Teams can select one of the following challenges:
 - Technology Challenge – On Target
 - Science Challenge – Medical Mystery
 - Engineering Challenge – Monster Effects
 - Fine Arts Challenge – Game On
 - Improv Challenge – Heads Up
 - Service Learning Challenge – Escape Artists
- There is even a non-competitive Rising Stars Challenge for students in pre-school through 2nd grade.
 - Pop Up
 - These teams present at tournament just like the higher levels but they are not ranked and do not advance to the state or Global Finals tournaments.
 - Kindergarten-2nd grade students may also choose to do a competitive challenges if they are up for the challenge

Why do educators like Destination Imagination?

- Destination Imagination is a learner-centric experience built completely on the creative process.
- Because the challenges are open-ended, students engage in deep inquiry and research while infusing prior knowledge and learning.
- The DI experience includes:
 - Ultimate learner ownership
 - Resource awareness
 - Clarifying questions
 - Rapid ideation and implementation
 - Authentic self-expression.

Here's How It Works

- Teams of 2-7 students
- Select one of the 2019 Team Challenges
- Meetings include solving the Team Challenge and practicing Instant Challenges
- Compete by Level
 - Rising Stars (non-competitive)
 - Elementary
 - Middle
 - Secondary

COST: \$30 for Rising Stars and \$65 for competitive students

This covers:

- Team Number/Licensing Fee
- Team Manager Background Check(s)
- Regional Tournament Registration
- Instant Challenge Day
- State Tournament if your team qualifies

Other costs include those for individual team's solution, snacks, field trips and T-shirts. Teams are encouraged to use borrowed, recycled and trash items whenever possible.
