Furthermore, in America, more than 1.5 million shelter animals are euthanized, including more than 700,000 dogs a year. Douglas County Canine Rescue believes that dogs should die naturally and is definitely not a kill rescue. Imagine giving someone you love, or a beloved pet of yours, to a shelter that would kill him/her if he or she is there for too long. Douglas County Canine Rescue doesn't believe a kill shelter is the correct option and wants to save as many dogs as possible, eventually giving them to foster parents for people to adopt.

Secondly, Douglas County Canine Rescue is located all over the state and is a fairly new organization. The rescue is officially located in Castle Rock, Colorado, but the foster parents can live anywhere in Colorado and the country (if they needed to). Douglas County Canine Rescue wants to save more dogs and give them more homes by being accessible all over Colorado.

Currently, Douglas County Canine Rescue is saving up for a van so they can transport dogs to safe places. . Douglas County Canine Rescue was started in 2014 and they have saved so many dogs. Over the past four years, the amount of dogs saved from kill shelters equals about 3,290 dogs. The number of puppies under two years of age that were adopted is about 375. Douglas County Canine Rescue is making it easier to adopt and save dogs by traveling all over Colorado, and they have saved more than 3,000 dogs' lives from kill shelters.
