



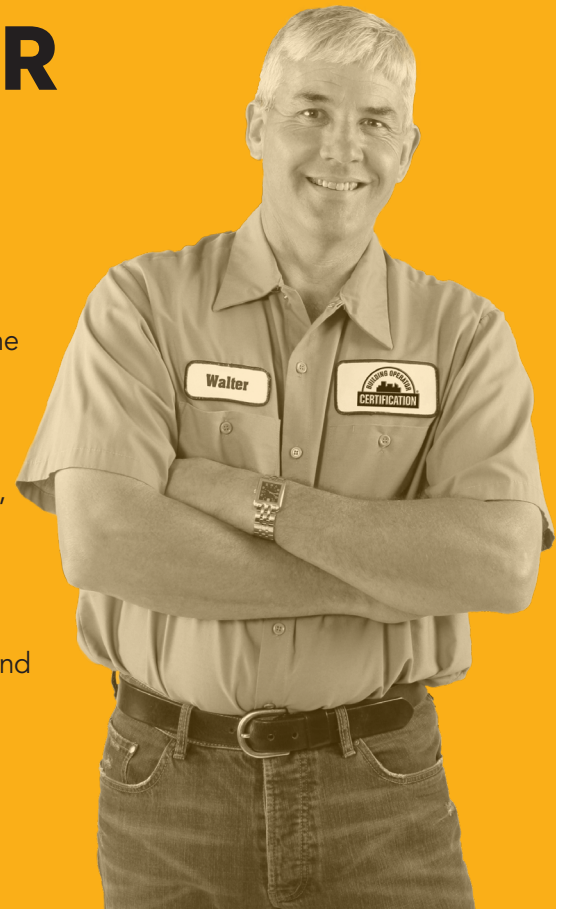

The Fundamentals of Energy Efficient Building Operations course provides the basic principles of energy efficiency awareness and practices in commercial buildings.
