### Gospel Reading

### ***Matthew 9:35--10:8***

*The mission of Jesus' followers is to continue the mission of Jesus himself. Here, he instructs his first disciples as to how they might proclaim the gospel through their words and deeds.*

<sup>35</sup>Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. <sup>36</sup>When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. <sup>37</sup>Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; <sup>38</sup>therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

<sup>10:1</sup>Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. <sup>2</sup>These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; <sup>3</sup>Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; <sup>4</sup>Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

<sup>5</sup>These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, <sup>6</sup>but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. <sup>7</sup>As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' <sup>8</sup>Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

# LIST OF MITIGATION RULES FOR IN PERSON WORSHIP

1. Use Hand Sanitizer as you enter into and leave the building.
2. Wear your face mask. We will have extras at the Church if you do not have one with you. Pastor will be more than 10 feet away and remove her mask while presiding.
3. Certain rows of chairs in the sanctuary are blocked off so we are separated by 6 ft. We ask you leave 3 empty chairs (i.e. 6 ft.) between you and anyone not in your household if you are sitting in the same row.
4. We are limiting our capacity to 50 people in attendance.
5. We are not using hymnals. Songs will be printed in Bulletins. Bulletins can be found on chairs and will be placed there 48-hours beforehand.
6. We will be initiating communion, practicing good protocol limited to wafers and no cup. This will be held monthly at first.
7. We will HUM rather than SING initially. Studies show that singing projects more air than coughing.
8. We will limit Service to approximately 30 minutes, since the longer people share the same air space the odds of spreading germs increase.
9. We will not have any contact during the passing of the peace but will stay at 6 ft. distances- sharing a peace sign, wave, hand over heart, or clasped hands and bow.
10. Offering Plates are placed in stationary positions to avoid the passing of the plate. Thank you for giving your offerings there.
11. We ask you to FILL OUT THE SHEET OF PAPER inside your bulletin and place it in the Offering Plate. This allows us to keep track of attendance. In case someone ends up ill, we want to let those who were in attendance know.
12. As you are dismissed, we will exit in a staggered rhythm to decrease proximity to one another.
13. If you must use a bathroom, please clean all touchable surfaces before and after usage. Spray disinfectant and paper towels are available in each bathroom.
14. Please do not linger too long in the Sanctuary. If you would like to visit, we suggest you do so outdoors while maintaining 6 ft. distances.
15. All coffee and food is suspended at this time.
