SNAP/EBT Benefits During the Federal Government Shutdown

Despite the ongoing federal government shutdown, **Virginia will continue to provide SNAP benefits** in November through the new <u>Virginia Emergency Nutrition Assistance</u>
(VENA) program.

Here's what City of Richmond residents need to know:

- Full benefits will still be loaded automatically onto existing EBT cards.
- Payments will be issued weekly instead of monthly.
- **Disbursements start November 3** and will be staggered by household.
