



Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) - Basic Implementation Strategies

Learn strategies and ideas to create communication opportunities using AAC during the course of every-day classroom and home activities. Utilize a variety of AAC systems and conversational targets to enhance vocabulary for the AAC user utilizing the principles of Aided Language Stimulation, Descriptive Teaching Models, and Social Scripting to increase expressive output in children who are using AAC.

Learning Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- identify the range of AAC from low to high tech.
- summarize and apply evidence-based AAC implementation techniques through hands-on practice.
- identify a universal set of core vocabulary target words to provide students access to a range of communicative functions.
- apply strategies to increase core vocabulary knowledge in limited verbal students using low tech AAC that is free and/or available in a classroom
- identify sources to create low-tech AAC options
- explain how to incorporate multi-modal supports and low tech AAC options to model symbol input for students across a variety of activities and settings
