## YOUTH INTERIOR DESIGN FORUM

This workshop provides high school students with the opportunity to **experience interior design firsthand**. During the workshop, students will explore the fundamentals of 2D and 3D concepts; learn basic drawing and illustration skills, play with color use and light effects, and learn how interior environments affect human behavior. At the end of the workshop, students will have new friends, new perspectives, and a personal portfolio full of ideas.

We will offer **four sessions during the spring semester and summer** in both online and on-campus formats, varying in duration. If you have an interest in pursuing interior design at the college level, make plans to attend this workshop. The workshops are each limited to 12 students so apply early to ensure your place.

By completing this workshop, you will have a portfolio of work – a required component of the application process in many accredited interior design programs and we will waive an interior design **3-credit hour elective course** if you declare a major in Interior Design at Ball State University.

We will use Canvas, Zoom, and/or WebEx throughout the workshop. Canvas provides a password-protected online environment where you can submit your work and communicate with the professor and fellow attendees using discussion boards, chat rooms for live discussions, and centralized email (Canvas Conversations). WebEx and Zoom allows us to meet with everyone in the online workshop without leaving the comforts of home. Canvas, WebEx, and Zoom require a computer with internet access. For the on-campus session, students will stay in newly renovated on-campus dorms. Each day, after the workshop, there will be many activities planned around Ball State's campus to show the students what college life may look like.
