Please know that a true staff member or leader at OSL/Melo will never ask you to make such purchases or ask for your personal credit card or banking information. If you ever get suspicious messages like these, do not respond to them. Instead, call the church office or me to report the scam attempt. This way we can help keep each other informed and safe.

OSL Council August 18th, Meeting Minutes

Members present: Betty DuBore, Donna Miller, Katie Benson, Wanda Gubrud, Wayne Torgerson,

Pastor Amber Kalina. Absent: Brittney Palm, Dustin Marquis.

The meeting was called to order by President Katie Benson at 7:00 pm. Pastor Amber opened with

devotions from an adaptation of Psalm 84.

<u>Agenda & Previous Meeting Minutes</u>: Pastor Amber asked to add 'Northlands Mission' to New Business. Wayne moved to approve the minutes and agenda with the addition; Betty seconded; motion passed.

Reports

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: <u>Income included a \$5K donation from the Warren Food Shelf in support of the Backpack program.</u>

<u>CD #2 matures on Aug 26. Betty moved to renew the CD plus the interest earned (\$110,507.79 total) for 5 mo. at 4.05%; Donna seconded; motion passed. Donna moved to approve the treasurer's report; Wayne seconded; motion passed.</u>

<u>Worship and Evangelism</u>: Committee met on Aug 11. Altar guild for Sept-Oct: Bev and Joan; Nov-Dec: Darby Boe. Pastor and Joan will pick hymns for September. Joan will attend a Poppler's music workshop on Aug 13. Confirmation Sunday is Oct 26 (Reformation Sunday). The Candlelight service will be on Dec 14 and the community will be invited to participate. The Christmas Eve service will be at 4:30 pm on Dec 24. The summer worship evening service has had very low attendance and next summer it may be moved to Monday evenings 1x per month.

<u>Education & Youth</u>: VBS was held on Aug 4-7 and went very well, with about 50 kids attending. Guests helping out were: Gladwin Lynne (lesson on bears), Brian Wurtzel (lesson on how to build a campfire) and a co-worker of Jeremy Woinarowicz from the DNR brought animal pelts and shared information. Sts. Peter & Paul borrowed decorations for their VBS. Parents of eight Sunday school families have agreed to teach 1x per month. Printed lessons from the Spark lectionary will be used instead of the online lesson plan. Rally Sunday is set for Sept 21, with plans for a meal following worship. Confirmation begins Sept 17 from 5:45-7 pm. The Sunday School Christmas program will be on Dec 21. Katie Jo and Katie have plans to clean and organize the rooms and supplies. A large second-hand conference table was purchased and will provide more room for lessons and crafts. The committee is looking at purchasing some new prints

<u>Property & Mgmt/Tech</u>: Miller Electric will be meeting with LS Integrators to test the fire alarm system and bring online. Narthex benches were reupholstered and valances were recovered with the new fabric. A new rinse aid pump for the dishwasher has been sourced and Joel will install it. Shades for the narthex north windows will be installed soon so we have the option of lowering them when desired. Joel installed a lever from the basement sump pit to enable switching the drainage to the storm drain; this completes the drainage project. Randy sowed grass seed where the lawn was torn up and is watering.

Stewardship/Outreach: Committee didn't meet; Betty will organize a meeting in September.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pastor Amber attended the ELCA church-wide assembly Jul 28-Aug 2 and voted on the election of a new Bishop, whom she was acquainted with as an instructor of hers at seminary. She informed that she helped lead VBS, did 10 homebound/hospital visits, <u>presided at one wedding and one funeral. She'll conduct the final summer evening worship on Aug 18. Pastor Amber has been planning Confirmation activities and will host a parent meeting soon. She'll take vacation Aug 25-27. She continues with planning and leading a book study on the Building Bridges committee. Ongoing activities: begin teaching Confirmation, attend several monthly meetings, visit homebound/hospitalized, conduct Sunday worship services and Monday morning bible study, continue working with the Pathways/Camp Emmaus board, and crafting facebook posts. Activities she's leading and we're moving along with are listed in Ongoing Business.</u>

Wayne moved to approve the committee reports; Betty seconded; motion passed.

- +Drawn to the Word: Pastor Paul Oman is scheduled to come on the evening of Sunday, Sept 28. He will paint a canvas to be installed on the south basement wall. Council decided on a theme of 'Feeding the 5000' and 48" x 72" for the size of the painting. We will need to assemble the canvas, plan a service and advertise.
- +<u>Rural Revival</u>: Pastor Rebel Hurd (Assistant to the Bishop) will preach on Sunday, Sept 28 to introduce the subject and describe the process at both Melo and OSL. Pastor Melissa Pickering will join worship on Sunday, Oct 12. Following the service there will be a forum to explain the program and she will do some interviews. We may provide a simple meal for attendees.
- +WAO School Summer Meal Program: The program is wrapping up. There are funds remaining and Katie is conferring with Supt. Hackbarth on how we want to proceed; possibly they can carryover the funds for next summer's meal program or use them in another way for feeding children at WAO.
- +<u>Church Financial Planner</u>: Pastor Amber reached out to Rebecca Palmgren from the ELCA Foundation who specializes in providing info/guidance on how to manage funds over and above what's required to keep in reserve for church operations. Council will meet with her in Sept to discuss ideas, inviting the Endowment Cmte and a few members with a

She then contacted Comstock Construction who are experienced in church sanctuary renovation and willing to assist us. We're looking at options for increasing space and

functionality, particularly in the front of the sanctuary.

New Business

+Church Rental Fees: Fees haven't been adjusted for many years and we'll consider updating them, in particular rental by non-members. Council will look at the current amounts and discuss at the next meeting.

<u>+Date of September Council Meeting</u>: Pastor Amber will be attending a church function on Sept 15. We'll postpone the next meeting until Sept 29.

<u>+Northlands Rescue Mission</u>: Pastor Amber was approached by a member about the dire financial straits the Mission recently found themselves in. They have since received donations to keep operations going but are often in need of funding. A motion was made by Donna to give \$4K from the budgeted amount for Mission donations to Northlands Mission in support of their programming; Wayne seconded; motion passed.
