Legislative Ethics Reform for Alaska



1. More transparency.

When a legislator votes on an issue they (or their immediate family) have a financial stake in, they must disclose it.



2. No more junkets.

Legislative travel abroad — often paid for by the state — must be approved and have an official legislative purpose.



3. No free lunch.

Lobbyists can no longer buy meals or alcoholic drinks for legislators.



4. Stronger accountability.

If an operating budget isn't passed on time (day 121 of the legislative session), per diem payments to legislators (as much as \$295 per day) will stop.

More trust. Alaska deserves it.
