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IPWMAN agencies help Woodridge recover

Thirty-two public works agencies who are members of the Illinois Public Works Mutual Aid Network (IPWMAN) deployed personnel and equipment to help fellow member Woodridge with clean up following the EF-3 tornado on Sunday, June 20, 2021. The tornado damage was approximately 3 blocks wide by 3 miles long.

One hundred fifteen IPWMAN members descended on the affected areas with the following equipment and labor spread over 6 days:

2 – Members of the Field Management Team who assisted with daily operational planning
9 - Brush Chippers
2 - Truck Mounted Aerial Lift Trucks
85 – Dump Trucks
10 – Loader Trucks
3 – Wheel Loaders
1 – Pickup Truck

The equipment cost was calculated to be \$67,025

The labor cost was calculated to be \$89,133

For a grand total of \$156,158

It was estimated by Woodridge and Homer Tree Care that the brush created over 10,000 cubic yards of wood chips. Woodridge lost 300+ trees due to the tornado.
