Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. - Romans 12:10

I find this verse speaks volumes in these times. God wants a living, breathing relationship with us that grows day by day. A strong relationship is built through good times and bad times. In marriage, parental, and friend relationships, it is often the difficult times that deepen the love, security, and strength of the bonds. This is also the case with God. So let us use Romans 12:10 to deepen our relationship with God through the trials and tribulations of life.

Rejoice in hope: In Philippians 4:4 we read the command: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4). No matter what the circumstances, we are to live in the hope of Jesus Christ. Rejoicing requires us to look for ways to be thankful and to look for what the Holy Spirit is doing around us. We also know that through faith in Jesus Christ, we have an eternal hope. See the joy in the now and look ahead to the joy of eternity.

Be Patient in Tribulation: Tribulation can mean any difficultly or struggle. We certainly had plenty the past couple of years! Frankly, my patience has worn thin. However, I am encouraged when I remember that "love is patient" (1 Corinthians 13:4). Instead of gritting my teeth trying to be patient, I can see patience as an act of love. I can be more patient, kind, gentle, and accommodating towards others if I treat them with love. Also, God loves us, therefore we can rest in His love while we wait for circumstances to change. While you wait ...

Be Constant in Prayer: Waiting for things to change is not meant to be a passive act. We have the privilege to play a major role in affecting change through prayer. We can either wait in frustration or we can "wait upon the Lord" (Isaiah 40:31) through prayer. "Being constant in prayer" challenges us to make prayer an ongoing conversation with God. I have sometimes neglected my prayers for pandemic to end because, "I've already prayed for that." But being constant in prayer challenges me to be like the persistent widow in the parable Jesus told "to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart" (Luke 18:1). The widow didn't give up asking until she received her answer. May we be constant in our prayers.

2021 Bible Reading Challenge!




