"Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in Your Word." — Psalm 119:18

Happy New Year! I pray that this year brings an end to the pandemic and an awakening to the Spirit of God throughout the land. The early Methodist circuit riding preachers were given the purpose "to reform the nation, by spreading scriptural holiness over the land." I pray that First United Methodist Church of Irving is an effective part of this process as we seek to spread scriptural holiness through being "a bright beacon of God's love to Irving and beyond."

To this end, we will continue to provide Bible Challenge readings so that we grow as disciples of Jesus Christ. Bible Challenge 2022 will be a little different. We will be reading smaller passages. There will typically be one passage each from the Old Testament, a Psalm, a New Testament letter, and a Gospel. We will be reading less each week than in previous years. You may find that you can read through the passages a few times during the week. This will allow us to focus more on our relationship with God as we listen for what God says to us through the reading of His Word. Certainly, it is important for us to gain knowledge *about* God as we read the Bible. In addition, however, Scripture is meant to deepen our relationship *with* God. In the end, we are not going to be tested on how much we know about the Bible. We will be asked by God, "How well do you know me?"

As you read the Bible challenge readings this year, I encourage you to listen to what God would say to you through His Holy Word. You may begin your time of Bible reading by praying, "Lord, open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in Your Word." As you read, listen for what God would say to you in the Scripture. Ask, "God, what do you want to say to me today?" What stirs in your heart as you read? How will you respond to God's word for you? To personalize this, as I read through the Bible Challenge readings this year, I want to listen in my heart for what God is saying to me through God's Holy Word and then I want to put this into action.

We must read Scriptures in the context of the entire Bible. We do not want to take a small passage out of context, so we keep the overall message of the Bible in mind. To help, here is a brief summary of the Bible: God created the world and everything in it, including us. God is love and God is holy, therefore God wants us to be in a loving and holy relationship with Him. Jesus, God's Son, came into the world so that our sins could be forgiven and that we might have a loving and holy relationship with God. The Holy Spirit is given to us to help us to live loving and holy lives. We are to act in loving and holy ways towards others. We are to help others have a loving and holy relationship with God.

God wants a deep relationship with you. May you use the Bible Challenge readings to grow closer to God and respond to God's word to you. I look forward to hearing about what God does in you and through you this year.
