#### Why I will disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church

If you are a member of our church, you received a letter and were invited to a presentation on September 14 regarding disaffiliating from The United Methodist Church. I am very grateful for the Disaffiliation Task Force who composed the letter and gave the presentation. The Task Force is comprised of the chairpersons of the Church Council (Sheryll Bunt), Staff-Pastor Relations Committee (Mickey Wheeler), Finance Committee (Bill Monty), the Lay Delegate to Annual Conference (Linda Wheeler), Trustees (Allan Knott) and the Lay Leader (Cindy Alleman). They were under the direction through a unanimous vote of the Church Council to engage in the disaffiliation process. I want to state that I was very much in favor of their work.

I was asked by several people as to why I did not speak at that meeting. The quick response is that the people are the church, and the members are tasked with voting on their future. Pastors are not even members of the church, so I have no vote in these matters. However, I believe you should be aware of where I stand as your pastor. My future will not be with The United Methodist Church. When this happens and how this happens in relation to First Irving is yet to be determined. My hope, of course, is that First Irving and I will disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church simultaneously.

The UMC is the only denomination I have ever joined. I was confirmed and baptized as a pre-teen in Florida, joined churches in Texas, and have been a clergy member since 2004. Over the many years, I have seen the continual degradation of the UMC away from its historical roots, theological foundation, and biblical authority. The Task Force presented many examples, and I could mention many, many more. The bottom line for me was summarized eloquently by a member who attended the presentation, "I'm not leaving the UMC; the UMC has left me."

To personalize this, my mother told me something that broke my heart and solidified why I must leave the UMC. She is my wonderfully proud mom who loves telling people that her youngest son is a pastor in Irving, Texas! She has received cards from members and was warmly received when she visited here. She asks about this church all the time and prays for you. When asked what denomination I pastor in, she reluctantly says, "He's United Methodist," but then quickly adds, "... but he's one of the good ones." My mom is reluctant to say that I am United Methodist! Frankly, when I encounter yet another example of United Methodist clergy and leadership going against biblical principles, I feel my mother's pain.

We are a connectional system. United Methodist Churches and pastors acting out contrary to our Discipline reflects on us all and is frankly inexcusable. I cannot remain a member of a denomination that my own mother cannot proudly endorse. A time-limited window of opportunity has been presented for churches and pastors to make a choice about their future. As for me, I love God, the Bible, and my mom too much to remain United Methodist.

If you would like to talk to me further about this, I would be honored to meet with you.

# **Discernment Task Force Update**

As you may know, we had a churchwide information meeting regarding possible disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church on Wed. Sept. 14<sup>th</sup>. This was not a Church Conference but was attended by our District Superintendent Rev. Edlen Cowley. There was a presentation by the Task Force representative Cindy Alleman followed by a Question & Answer time led by the entire team, plus Rev. Cowley. A non-binding "straw vote" indicating where members currently stand regarding disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church was taken. The result of the vote was that 81% chose yes to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. This vote was to be an indication to the Discernment Task Force to continue the discernment process. This could lead to a Church Conference where a final vote would be taken.

The Annual Conference asked Rev. Jill Jackson-Sears, who is Senior Pastor of Lake Highlands UMC and the President of our local Wesleyan Covenant Association, to pick four other representatives to join her at a meeting on September 27<sup>th</sup> at the Annual Conference offices. Rev. Jackson Sears asked Mickey Wheeler to serve on the team. The team met with the Assistant to the Bishop along with other major chairs or directors of committees of the Annual Conference such as Board of Trustees, Board and Pensions and Health Benefits, Connectional Resources, Treasurer, etc. The meeting was an attempt to negotiate a more amicable separation from the North Texas Annual conference. While we made some headway on our objectives, we still believe the Annual Conference needs to agree to more favorable terms, particularly financially. Our Task Force does have a scheduled meeting on October 3<sup>rd</sup> with Rev. Cowley to discuss what is next in the process.

Our goal is to expand our Children's Programming on Wednesday Night to include a light meal at 5:00 and an art lesson from 5:30-6:00. After the art lesson children would attend Children's

Choir rehearsal from 6:00-6:45. We are looking for volunteers who can commit to preparing and serving the meal and be present during the art activity. We believe that parents would be more likely to enroll their kids if we include a meal. If you can help, please contact Jennifer or Traci.

Our next Free Friday Fun Night on October 14<sup>th</sup> (6:00-8:00pm) is going to a little different. We are asking families to attend instead of just the children. We are looking for church members to act as stand in family members for kids whose parents cannot attend. Families will learn a song and be asked to attend church to sing the song with their kids on October 16<sup>th</sup>, which is the Children's Sabbath.

Our annual Fall Festival is right around the corner. Please bring wrapped candy and small trinkets to church. The Fall Festival Committee has set the ambitious attendance goal of 600 people. We need everyone's help spreading the word about the event. We also set the goal of gaining 7 new church or Free Friday Fun Night attendees from this outreach. **Please pray that we meet or even exceed our goal.**
