[Jesus said,] "If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. " - Luke 9:23

Darrow and Vicki Frazier are our missionaries serving with Cadence International reaching Marines for Christ for over ten years. We heard their call story on Sunday (watch here: https://www.fumcirving.org/thesermons/darrow-frazier-missionary-to-okinawa-8-7-22/.

Darrow told us that he wants the marines to become "Christ-followers." This phrase has really captured me. The word "Christian" has tended to lose its meaning. Society lumps all Christians together, usually in a negative way. Many people believe that going to a church makes you a Christian. Christians may just be not something else, not a Jew or a Muslim, or a Hindu. Yet being a Christian is being a Christ-follower.

Jesus said, "If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." This is a packed statement. Being a Christ-follower means that we consider the other person more than ourselves. Being a Christ-follower means that we willingly sacrifice our time, money, energy, and desires for Christ. Being a Christ-follower means that we do all this daily. Being a Christ-follower means that we are not following our own ideas or the trends of society or our friends or even our pastor! A Christ-follower follows Jesus Christ!

There are very practical steps for being a Christ-follower:

- 1) A Christ-follower is a person of prayer. To follow Christ, we must be in a relationship with Him. A relationship is only developed through conversation. Are you daily talking to God through prayer and daily listening to God through prayer?
- 2) A Christ-follower is a person of the Bible. To follow Christ, we must grow in knowledge of Christ wants us to be. This knowledge comes through the Holy Bible. Are you reading the Bible regularly? Are you reading our weekly Bible Challenge reading?
- 3) A Christ-follower is a person of the Church. Jesus gathered people together. Jesus knows that we cannot do this on our own. We need each other. We need the church. Are you regularly attending worship services? If you can only attend on-line, are you actively engaging in the worship service? Are you connecting in a group like a Sunday School class? Is Jesus saying, "Follow me to worship this Sunday?"
- 4) A Christ-follower is a person of service. Jesus commands us to love our neighbors. This can be in the church through children, youth, choir, the sack lunch ministry, Shepherd's Care Team, ushering, Wednesday Work Crew, etc., etc. This can be in the community through organizations like Many Helping Hands, Crisis Ministries, Family Promise, giving blood, etc. etc. This can be in your "neighborhood" through visiting, cooking a meal, calling a lonely person, writing an encouraging note, etc. etc. Where is Christ saying to you, "Come, follow me to serve here?"

Discernment Task Force Update

We want to inform you of the progress of the Discernment Task Force that the Church Council appointed on May 23 to collect and disseminate information about possible disaffiliation form the United Methodist Church. We have been working hard to finalize information for our presentation to the congregation. We have been meeting regularly to accomplish this task and have completed two practice presentations, the first with the Church Council. The second was to incorporate the council's suggestions and questions. We were hoping to have started the public meetings, except that the North Texas Annual Conference is changing the Disaffiliation Process almost weekly. Just in the last few days, substantial changes were made that impacts the presentations. We are expecting that more significant changes could be made within the next few days. These changes have occurred so frequently, and make such an impact on our presentation, that we are probably looking at altering the format to a single churchwide presentation. Because the Church Council resolution was for us to prepare small group meetings, we will ask them formally at the Church Council meeting this month to allow us to make the presentation in a single churchwide setting. If Church Council approves, we anticipate making the announcement of that date very soon.
