So, What's the Plan for 2021?

And Jesus said, "Follow me." Matthew 4:19

I wrote in January 2020: "This will be an interesting year (aren't they all!), but if we keep our focus on faithfully following Jesus and being empowered by the Spirit then we are doing what God wants us to do this year." Who would have known how "interesting" (to put it very mildly) 2020 would end up being? I was asked by our church council chair, Marni Monty, to present a vision for our church for this year. Considering the craziness of 2020, I put down these thoughts knowing that "We can make our plans, but the Lord determines our steps" (Proverbs 16:9).

A Vision for First United Methodist Church of Irving for 2021:

- 1) Stay God-focused. Bring people to God the Father, proclaim Jesus as our Savior *and* Lord (Jesus saves us *and* directs our thoughts and actions), and be Spirit-led.
- 2) Stay biblically-based. Not only do we lead the church from Scripture, but we also excite people to read the Bible for themselves as the inspired Word of God.
- 3) Reinforce who we are as Methodists. We have a message to share about God's grace working in all, God's grace leading people to saving faith in Jesus Christ, and God's grace maturing people in the faith to live, think, and act as faithful followers of Christ.
- 4) Continue to balance the need to gather as a church, whether in worship or smaller groups, with the commitment to protecting ourselves and others from the pandemic. We cannot predict what will happen with COVID-19 in 2021, but we will continue to follow safe guidelines while finding ways to minister to the congregation. Our on-line worship, outdoor worship, and socially distanced in-person worship will continue.
- 5) Reach out to our neighbors as a beacon of God's light to Irving and beyond. We will share the hope of Jesus Christ by being intentional about inviting others to join us whether in-person or on-line. We will show the love of Jesus Christ through our sack lunch ministry, Family Promise, Many Helping Hands, and other ministries to those in need. We will also impact the world for Christ through our partnership with missions in places like Okinawa and Guatemala. I hope we will have the opportunity for a mission trip to Guatemala in 2021, but this is still yet to be decided due to the pandemic.
- 6) Be a people of prayer! We are called to pray for each other, pray for our church and church leaders, and pray for our denomination. We are called to pray intentionally for those who need to accept Jesus as their savior. We are called to listen intentionally to God's still small voice as God speaks to us in our prayers.

As we sing:

*Where He leads me I will follow. Where He leads me I will follow.
Where He leads me I will follow. I'll go with Him, with Him all the way.*
