Report from Transition Team (Formerly the Discernment Task Force)

As most of you know we took a disaffiliation vote on Oct. 22 at a Church Conference called by Rev. Edlen Cowley the DS of the Metro District of North Texas Annual Conference.

The vote did carry by 91% (90.6% to be exact) in favor of disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church.

On Oct. 24 by a unanimous vote of the Church Council the Discernment Task Force was renamed the Transition Team.

The Task Force (now Team) has been working all along with what would we do should the church vote to disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church. We have discussed several options from remaining independent to joining other Wesleyan based Methodist denominations. Our strong recommendation is to join the Global Methodist Church. The GMC best represents the values and beliefs of our church. The GMC provides the easiest and best transition as many of our structures and practices would remain in place. Unlike the UMC, there is an easy way to exit the GMC in the future so there is really no downside at this point.

On Sunday, November 13, at 5:00 PM, the Rev. Dr. Leah Hidde-Greggory, President Pro-Tem of the Mid Tex Annual Conference of the Global Methodist Church will give a short presentation and answer any questions we may have about the GMC. "President Pro-Tem" means that she the acting Bishop of the Mid-Tex Conference. For the 5:00 PM presentation, we are honoring a request to invite other interested churches in the North Texas Conference to hear about the GMC as well. On that same evening, following the presentation and Q&A, we recommend that the church have a vote on affiliation with the Global Methodist Church. This is a vote requiring a simple majority (50%) of members present.



The Children's Department is busy. As I write this, we are looking forward to the Fall Festival. I can't tell you how grateful I am for all the provisions God has made for the event. He has provided volunteers, candy/ trinket donations and monetary donations. Please pray that this outreach will be a catalyst to bring someone to know Jesus.

We had 26 kids, 13 parents, 6 youth volunteers, and 14 adult volunteers attend, for a total of 15 total families participating! It was powerful to see families eating, playing, painting, singing and praying together. For our November Free Friday Fun Night, the theme will be patriotism, in honor of Veteran's Day. We always welcome new volunteers.

We want to thank everyone for Children's Sunday. The kids were proud to participate in service with the Lord's Prayer, the Apostle's Creed and the Offertory Prayer as well as singing. We appreciate your generous donations. The Noisy Offering raised \$711. Thank you so much!!

On November 6, it will be everyone birthday in Children's Sunday School. We have several children with birthdays in November, so we decided to celebrate everyone's birthday on November 6th during our gathering time. If you have children or if you know kids that only attend occasionally, make every effort to get them to Sunday School on November 6th.

We have many more events coming up like the City of Irving Christmas Parade, decorating for Christmas and Ornament Making. If you are looking for a way to get more involved, we would love to have you help us in the Children's department.
