Acts 10:34-43

A Reading from the book of Acts.

Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ--he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. 

Believe it or not, our January dinner for the men at the Friends of the Homeless Shelter is **THIS** week! **Wednesday, January 11.**

HOME COOKS:

- Your choice of bar cookies/brownies OR "regular" cookies, i.e. chocolate chip, oatmeal, snicker-doodles, etc.
- From the living room corner table, please pick-up **two** square pans or a large Ziplock bag for **3 dozen** cookies and return to Education Building's Kitchen by 3 p.m. on Wednesday
- Please let me know which you plan to provide
- Pick-up can be arranged if needed

KITCHEN CREW:

- As always, **3-4** people are needed at **2 p.m.** to put the sides together - I guarantee you will finish before **5 p.m.** or however long you can stay
- Please let me know what your time availability is so we can divvy-up tasks accordingly

TRANSPORTERS / SERVERS:

- **Two** vehicles are needed at **5:30 p.m.** to transport the dinners - you can stay and serve if you so desire, but double duty is not mandatory
- We need a minimum of **5** servers at **6 p.m.** at the shelter -- **6** would be preferred, the more the merrier
