



He presented a class, entitled *The Blues: Roots and Branches* for the OLLI at Denver University.

Trip Itinerary

Trip Itinerary is based on current information and may change due to local circumstances/conditions. Thank you for your understanding.

Day 1: Sunday, November 17 Check-in, Registration, Orientation, Welcome Dinner

Hotel check-in begins at 4 p.m., followed by a Program Orientation and a Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Monday, November 18 Danny Thomas Pavilion, Botanic Garden, Rock 'n' Soul Museu m

This morning, travel by motorcoach with a local expert to the Danny Thomas Pavilion to learn about the life of Danny Thomas, the history of American Lebanese Syrian Associated Charities and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Next, ride to the Memphis Botanic Garden for an expert-led field trip followed by lunch. Travel back into downtown Memphis for a stop at the Rock 'n' Soul Museum – the first museum ever jointly developed by the Smithsonian Institution and the National Museum of American History. Dinner is on your own to explore the local fare. Later, return to the hotel for a film about the early years of Elvis Presley.

Day 3: Tuesday, November 19 Beale Street History, Jazz Study & Music, Belz Museum

Start the day with a private session by a local expert who will talk about Beale Street and the Memphis music scene. Ride to the Beethoven Club, a local musical institution, where our expert will discuss music history and perform examples of Memphis styles of music. Clap and sing along to old time favorites while learning about syncopation. Enjoy lunch on your own before rejoining the group to walk to the Belz Museum. The Belz features over 1,000 objects, including works of jade, tapestries, furniture, carvings and other historical and artistic objects, as well as one of the finest collections of pieces from the Qing dynasty. Enjoy dinner as a group followed by an evening at leisure to continue exploring Memphis.

Day 4: Wednesday, November 20 Mighty Mississippi, Sun Studio, Graceland, B.B. King's Club

This morning, learn from an expert about the mighty Mississippi River and its role in the growth of Memphis and the nation as a whole. After the lecture, board the motorcoach to Sun Studio, a recording studio opened by rock pioneer Sam Phillips in 1950 recognized as the birthplace of rock 'n' roll. Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis, Roy Orbison and many more made their name here through the '50s. Depart Sun Studio for a field trip to the 14-acre estate Graceland that was the home of Elvis Presley, now a virtual shrine with museums, films, and exhibits for a unique glimpse into the life and times of The King. Dinner will be at the famous B.B. King's Blues Club. The house band is B.B. King's All Stars, and guest musicians include some of the best in the business for one of the most diverse, sophisticated lineups of modern blues and R&B in Memphis. After dinner, enjoy more great live music on world-famous Beale Street before returning to the hotel.

Day 5: Thursday, November 21 Stax Museum, Civil Rights Museum, Blues Hall of Fame

Begin the day with a visit to the Stax Museum of American Soul Music. Learn about the gospel roots of soul from a carefully reassembled Mississippi Delta church and dance along to Soul Train videos on the Express Yourself dancefloor. Following lunch at a local restaurant, travel by motorcoach to the National Civil Rights Museum – a privately-owned complex of museums and historic buildings built around the former Lorraine Motel, where Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated on April 4, 1968. Follow a timeline that charts the course of events around the assassination and the impact and legacy of the civil rights movement. Head to the Blues Hall of Fame and enjoy ten individualized galleries with interactive touchscreen displays along with three master databases where you can hear the music, watch videos and read the stories of each of the inductees. Enjoy a Farewell Dinner at a local restaurant.
