

### **Chelsea Beck – Class of 2008**

Chelsea was a four-year letterman in both swimming and water polo and a team captain in both sports. In swimming, Chelsea led her team to four PIAA District Team Championships (2004-2008). She was part of the PIAA Class AAA State Runner-Up and All-American 200 Freestyle Relay (2007) and the 400 Freestyle Relay (2008) as well as being a part of the PIAA Class AAA State third place and All-American 200 Medley Relay (2008). Individually, Chelsea is a Wilson Top 12 swimmer in the 200 Freestyle and 400 Freestyle Relay. In water polo, Chelsea was named Rookie of the Year in the state of Pennsylvania during her freshman season and was part of the 2005 State Championship Water Polo Team. She earned First Team All-Berks, First Team All-State, Second Team All-American, and Berks County Water Polo Player of the Year during her senior season. Nationally, Chelsea played water polo at the Junior Olympic Water Polo Tournament and represented the Northeast at the Zones National Water Polo Tournament in 2007. Chelsea continued her athletic career at Wagner College and then professionally in Australia for the Melbourne Collegians and Adelaide Jets.

### **Dave Moyer – Class of 1976**

Dave was a multi-sport athlete for Wilson from 1974-1976. As a wrestler, Dave was coached by his father William Moyer, and was part of teams that achieved three consecutive undefeated Berks County Championships. Dave continued his wrestling career as a Nationally Ranked Division 1 Wrestler at Lock Haven State College, where he competed in the Eastern Wrestling League and NCAA Division 1 Wrestling Championships.

### **Doug Myer – Class of 1990**

Doug graduated in 1990 from Wilson where he was an outstanding all-around athlete in cross country, soccer, basketball, and track, earning 11 varsity letters overall. He was an All-County soccer player and started on the school's first District 3 championship team in 1988. In track, Doug was a county champion in both the 1600 meter and 3200 meter. He was a member of the Berks County championship basketball team in 1988. Doug won the John Spadafora Award as Wilson's outstanding senior scholar-athlete. He returned to Wilson as a high school math teacher and a coach in the fall of 1998. As a long-time head coach in cross country, head coach in girls' basketball, and assistant coach in track, Doug has helped coach all three programs to District 3 championships and multiple Berks County championships. He has enjoyed his greatest success in girls' basketball, winning five Berks County championships and three District 3 AAAA championships.

### **Vanessa Rivera – Class of 2008**

Vanessa is a 2008 graduate of Wilson where she led both her field hockey and basketball teams to multiple championships. She was selected 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Berks and 1st Team All-State her senior year in field hockey, and her team won the County Championship for the first time in 34 years. She also received the Berks County Field Hockey Coaches Association Outstanding Senior Award in 2007. In basketball, Vanessa was a four year starter, finishing her career with 1,363 points. She was a three time 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-County pick and 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-State her senior year. During her four years, the girls' basketball team won two county championships (2006 and 2008), a District III title (2008) and was a state semi-finalist (2008). Her senior year, Vanessa was named Reading Eagle's Berks Female Athlete of the Year, Army Female Athlete of the Year, and was given Wilson High School's Outstanding Female

Athlete Award. Vanessa continued her basketball career at Washington and Jefferson College, where she earned four varsity letters.

#### **Samantha Simcox – Class of 2008**

Samantha is a 2008 graduate of Wilson where she earned three varsity letters in field hockey, four varsity letters in basketball, and was the team captain on both teams her senior year. She was selected All-Berks and 2<sup>nd</sup> team All-State her senior year in field hockey and her team won the county championship and finished fourth in the district. In basketball, she was selected All-Division in her senior year. During her four years, the girls' basketball team won the county championship in 2006 and 2008, the district championship in 2008, and was a state semifinalist in 2008. Samantha continued her basketball career at King's College, where she earned three varsity letters, was the captain of the team her senior year, and led them to the sweet sixteen in the NCAA Division III Tournament.

#### **Patricia Stubblebine – Class of 1947**

Patricia played on all teams that were available for high school girls at the time: basketball, volleyball, track, and cheerleading. She was a cheerleader in her junior and senior years for basketball and football. In her senior year, her volleyball team won the All-County Championship and she was captain of the team. She played basketball for three years in high school. In track she ran relay, the 100 yard dash, broad jump, and high jump, where she won a bronze medal at the All-County meet at Kutztown College. In her senior year, Patricia was awarded the Outstanding Girl Athlete Award and the Wilson Varsity Club Award.

#### **Nick Woomer – Class of 2008**

Nick participated in Swimming and Water Polo. Nick was a key contributor on two State Champion Swim Teams, one of which he served as the Captain during his senior year, and 2 State Runner-Up Water Polo Teams. Individually, he placed 1st in the 200 Medley Relay, 2nd in the 50 Freestyle, 3rd in the 100 Backstroke, and 8th in the 400 Free Relay, to help lead the Swim Team to a 2008 State Championship. Nick achieved All-American, All-State and All-League status in a variety of events. He received both the Wilson Hall of Fame Athlete of the Year Award and the Berks County Aquatic Club Swimmer of the Year Award in 2008 for his accomplishments. Nick continued his swimming career at the University of Delaware, where he set a University Record in the 200 Free Relay and lettered all 4 years of his collegiate career. Nick also qualified for, and competed in, the 2011 National Swimming Championships in Atlanta.
