- Or you may pinch two fingers over one hand and the Celebrant will intinct (dip) the edge of the bread in the Common Cup for you, then drop the bread gently into your outstretched hands.
- If you prefer to receive only bread, simply cross one arm across your chest as you hold out your hand for bread.
- You may cross your arms over your chest and simply receive a blessing.
