The Lessons

Reader A Reading from Acts (10:34-43)

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Presentation of Candidates for Baptism (Candidates & Sponsors)

Priest The Candidates will now be presented.

Presenters We present *N*, to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Priest Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents &

Godparents I will, with God's help.

Priest Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents &

Godparents I will, with God's help.

Then the Priest asks the following questions of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants.

Priest Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer *I renounce them.*

Priest Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer *I renounce them.*

Priest Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer *I renounce them.*

Priest Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?"

Priest Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?
People *I will, with God's help.*

Priest Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?
People *I will, with God's help.*

Priest Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?
People *I will, with God's help.*

Priest Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
People *I will, with God's help.*

Priest Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
People *I will, with God's help.*

In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

The Baptism

Priest *N, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.*

Then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

Because of ongoing health concerns, the Celebrant will intinct (dip) the edge of the bread in the Common Cup for you, then drop the bread gently into your outstretched hands. If you prefer to receive only bread, simply cross one arm across your chest as you hold out your hand for bread.
