



GET OUT AND VOTE!!

The primary election on August 2nd, 2022 is a key and very important election in the process of electing officials to government offices. We have a primary system that sets the top two candidates for the general election in November. With the entire Washington state House of Representatives, and half the state Senate up for election in November, this primary election could have a major effect on who is on the ballot in November. This is not a question of Democrats versus Republicans, or vice versa. It is a question of who supports the motorcycling community of Washington, and who obstructs us in moving forward and protecting our freedoms.

Here's what I am asking each member of ABATE statewide to do; follow the link I am providing, find and contact the candidates from your district and ask them where they stand on motorcycle issues in Washington state. Do they support lane sharing? Do they support motorcyclists in other ways? If you find they do, get out and vote them into office. There are some key members of the legislature that have been an obstruction to our motorcycle legislation, and even been directly responsible for killing bills, or delaying them long enough that they do not make it past cut-off dates. With a single phone call, you can learn from each candidate where they stand on our issues, and vote for one that supports us. If enough members of the motorcycling community do this, then we can fundamentally change the make-up of both parties and get them to support the freedom of the road and protect the lives of motorcyclists.
