- 1.- Knowing (Mind)
- 2.- Being (Feelings, Mindfulness, Spirituality)
- 3.- Doing (Practice)

The *Knowing* section will present theories and conceptual model about, or research studies focused on developing a sustainability mindset, again in the context of leadership.

The *Being* section will present examples of transformative change – in ourselves or followers – in leading institutions or in communities. Also exercises and practices of leadership, that have documented evidence of transformative leadership, are welcome.

The *Doing* section will offer examples or case studies of projects designed by faculty and/or students in which stakeholders have worked together to lead themselves or others to further evolve a sustainability mindset or create practical notable impact, whether in their school, community, government or in some stakeholder group; in leadership context.

All chapters (around 10,000 - 15,000 words) will need to be grounded in literature, be rigorous in their construction and presentation, written in APA format, and be of practical value to educators, persons in leadership positions and/or leadership development professionals who desire to develop a more enhanced sustainability mindset.

We need from you a 250-word abstract for your chapter.

- *Submissions are due by October 15, 2020 with final chapter sign-off by December 15, 2020.
