School of Nursing

The University of Delaware School of Nursing (UDSON) is situated within the College of Health Sciences at UD, one of the oldest universities in the United States, with origins dating back to 1743, chartered by the state of Delaware in 1833. The UDSON is the largest educational institution of pre-licensure nursing and baccalaureate nursing within Delaware. The BSN degree is offered through three programs: a traditional, on-campus four-year program; an accelerated, second degree, on-campus 17-month program; and an online post-licensure (Registered Nurse to BSN) program. Over 700 students are enrolled across the BSN programs.



Additionally, the SON offers several graduate degree programs: Master's in Health System Leadership, Post-master's Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner program, Doctorate in Nursing Science, and Doctorate in Nursing Practice. The UDSON oversees the operation of the Nurse Managed Primary Care Center (NMPCC) located at UD's Science, Technology and Advanced Research (STAR) Campus. In addition to primary care services provided by the NMPCC, the STAR Campus offers physical therapy, speech, language and hearing therapy, mental health services, care coordination, nutrition counseling,

exercise counseling, health coaching, and a concussion clinic. The UDSON fosters student learning and professional development through experiential learning, a state-of-the art simulation center, community health initiatives, service learning projects, interprofessional education, healthcare theatre, study abroad opportunities, an honors program, and faculty mentorship. In 2018, the UDSON was designated a Center of Excellence in Creating Environments that Enhance Student Learning and Professional Development by the National League for Nursing.●
