This Week In 3rd Grade

Reading - We will continue to analyze and critique how authors use structures in print and multimedia texts to craft informational and argument writing.

Writing - Continue to work on Text Dependent Analysis. We will also continue the writing process for our opinion writing piece that will go along with our PBL on animals.

Spelling - Students will receive new words this week. There are 3 different lists. Please make sure that your child is keeping track of their list and they are completing at least 3 spelling activities a week for homework. Our spelling test will be Friday, May 4th.

Math - We will have our test on geometry and then will start learning more about fractions. We are also working on reviewing skills that we have worked on throughout the school year as well as some test taking strategies in preparation for the SC Ready state assessment.

*Students should be practicing their multiplication facts. We will continue to have timed assessments on Fridays.

Science - We will continue to explore how plants and animals adapt to changes in their environments. We will also begin to look at food chains and food webs. Students will construct a model habitat for the animal they have chosen to research.
