### This Week In 3rd Grade

Reading -We will continue to look at point of view. We will learn how the author's use of point of view, perspective and purpose shape content, meaning, and style in literature. Students will be able to determine use of first and third points of view. They will also compare and contrast their point of view to that of the narrator, author, or character.

Writing - Text Dependent Analysis - Students will continue to practice the use of text dependent analysis. This is a style of writing that requires a student to read a text or passage and use actual text to support their answers, citing specific evidence directly from the text while interpreting the meaning behind the evidence they provide. They will be using this skill on the SC Ready Test.

Spelling - Students will continue with the same lists this week. There are 3 different lists. Please make sure that your child is keeping track of their list and they are completing at least 3 spelling activities a week for homework. Our spelling test will be this Friday, March 2nd.

Reading Logs - Students should be reading 20-30 minutes a day and should complete 4 reading log questions. Reading Logs are assigned on Monday and are due the following Monday. Many students are neglecting to complete their Reading Logs at home.

Math - Students will be learning about properties of multiplication and about equations over the next couple of weeks. This unit is proving to be very difficultly and some students will need extra support/practice at home sometimes.

Social Studies - Students will continue to study the American Revolution and how this period in history had an impact on South Carolina as well as how it shaped the beginning of our nation.

PBL - We will continue to explore how the people of SC adapted to change throughout history.
