Welcome to St. Francis-in-the-Fields!

Whether you're a guest or a member, rich or poor, young or old; whatever your political alignment, racial background, gender, ethnicity, or country of origin; no matter if you're a cradle Episcopalian, from another faith expression, or claim no faith at all - we're glad you've joined us for worship today. Worship: Our liturgy follows the *Book of Common Prayer* (BCP), found in the book rack, with some material from *Enriching our Worship* (EOW). Our hymns come from the blue and green hymnals in the pews, along with other resources. All text for the service is printed in the bulletin. You are invited to prepare your soul for worship by kneeling silently in your pew before the service begins.

Children: We welcome all young children in our worship services, and ask you not to worry if your child is active or makes noise. "Busy Bags" for kids are available from the Ushers. Our "Children's Room" in the office hallway is available if at any time your infant or child needs a change of scenery.

Accessibility: At different times during worship, the congregation may stand or kneel according to custom. Those who suffer physical discomfort are invited remain seated, or stand or kneel as they are able. During Communion, please notify an Usher if you are unable to come forward and we will bring Communion to you. Gluten-free communion wafers are available.

Facilities: Two public restrooms are located in the office hallway.

A Reading from the Letter of James

For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. Music in Ministry

For the month of September, the postludes will come from a set of organ pieces called “*The 8 Little Preludes and Fugues*” which are usually attributed to J. S. Bach. However, musicologists are almost entirely sure that Bach did not compose these pieces. Some aspects of the piece matches Bach’s style. For example, every prelude and fugue is in a slightly different style which Bach would absolutely have done. In fact, this is what most people consider Bach’s greatest genius. Bach not only wrote the finest examples of Baroque music, he searched out all of the styles of Baroque music from around the world so that he could write the best examples of *every style* of baroque music. However, the “*The 8 Little Preludes and Fugues*” are not the finest examples of Bach’s compositional ability. This makes many musicologists believe that it was actually Bach’s students (possibly Johann Krebs, W. F. Bach) who likely composed these pieces as they lack the complexity that Bach would infuse in all of his pieces.
