Covid-19 Precautions in our classrooms

Safety in our classrooms continues to be a top priority at Drive Smart Georgia.

However, we have updated our COVID-19 precautions to align with **Gov. Kemp's new executive order** that he signed on April 30, 2021 and revised CDC recommendations about mask wearing and social distancing. In keeping with the executive order and CDC guidelines, Drive Smart Georgia has revised our COVID-19 precautions in classrooms to below.

- Prior to entering the classroom, each student must answer a quick **health questionnaire** and have their temperature checked with a **no-contact scan thermometer**.
- If our teachers have shown proof of being fully vaccinated, they have the option of wearing a mask during Drivers Ed classes.
- Fully vaccinated students do not have to wear a mask during class. If parents or students are concerned about Covid-19, they always have the option to wear a mask, even if fully vaccinated. Students who are not fully vaccinated are **strongly encouraged** to wear a mask throughout the 30-hour course.
- Before and after each and every class, Drive Smart Georgia will use a **commercial-grade disinfecting unit** that is 100% safe to not only remove germs, but to disinfect them. This is an above and beyond precaution that we are happy to offer.
- In addition to using our commercial-grade disinfecting unit, our teacher will **disinfect all surfaces** (doors, doorknobs, light switches, desks, chairs, faucets, desks, chairs, pens – everything that is touched!) **three times per day**. Yes, we have plenty of hand sanitizer for all students too. Before and after breaks, students will be asked to wash their hands, the best defense against COVID-19.
- All classroom teachers have signed agreements that they will **NOT** report to work if they are not feeling well.
- Teachers will take the students outside as often as possible for **fresh air breaks**.
