

From Pastor Matt

Thanksgiving is a big deal in my family. It is one of my favorite days of the year. Preparations last all week until Thanksgiving Day when we gather at my mom and dad's house with uncles, aunts, cousins, brothers, sisters, nieces, and nephews. Our hearts overflow with warm joy, and our tables overflow with food. Every year, the abundance is striking.

As I experience this abundance in my life, I am also aware that many of our neighbors in Central North Carolina and Wake County struggle to have enough to eat. Here are some facts on hunger in Central North Carolina (34 counties) from food-bankcenc.org:

- In 2020, 760,000 Central North Carolinians regularly faced hunger.
- In Wake County, 159,740 residents were “food insecure” (15% of the population).
- This included 55,420 children (22% of children).
- 21,016 citizens over age 65 lived at or below the poverty line.
- Food insecurity significantly increases the risk of developing chronic illnesses.
- Hunger negatively impacts school performance and high school graduation rates.

I am thankful that our church is actively engaged in addressing food insecurity. In 2022, we have supplied the Feed the Pack pantry and the Taylor-Burroughs Marketplace at Alliance for AIDS NC. Our youth provide Wee Care families with weekend food bags, and we have served meals at Oak City Cares and the Helen Wright Center. Members deliver for Meals on Wheels, and, just last Saturday, we packed 20,000 meals through Rise Against Hunger to impact global hunger.

Another opportunity to feed our neighbors is through our annual Thanksgiving Food Box ministry. The sign up is currently posted on the church website at hbumc.org/signups.

We need your participation! I ask that you:

- (1) Pray. Pray about food insecurity in North Carolina.
- (2) Give. Donate food and/or money for Thanksgiving Food Boxes by Tuesday, November 15.
- (3) Serve. Participate in sorting, packing, and/or delivering the boxes on Friday, Saturday, and/or Sunday (November 18-20).

Also, behind all the statistics mentioned above are real families and real lives. As a church, we want to deepen our relationship with our neighbors experiencing food insecurity and/or being served through local non-profits. Therefore, our Outreach Committee is organizing three meals to build these deeper connections.

First, you all are invited to share a Thanksgiving meal on Sunday, November 13, at 12:30pm at Millbrook UMC with the families of Iglesia Cristiana and the Seeds of Hope ministry. We are celebrating the successes of Neighbor2Neighbor and Seeds of Hope with these families. You are invited to bring your favorite dish and share in the celebration. Second, we are serving breakfast to our homeless neighbors at Oak City Cares on Saturday, October 29 (hbumc.org/signups). Third, in the beginning of 2023, we will share a meal with refugee families through Refugee Hope Partners (TBD).

Yes, there are ample opportunities to serve. No one person can do it all. However, I ask that you pray how God is leading you to participate in the work of feeding and serving our neighbors. Together, we can help feed local families this Thanksgiving season and celebrate all that God is doing in their lives. In His Service, Matt




September Finance Update


