A Day Apart Retreat at Cedar Cross - March 27

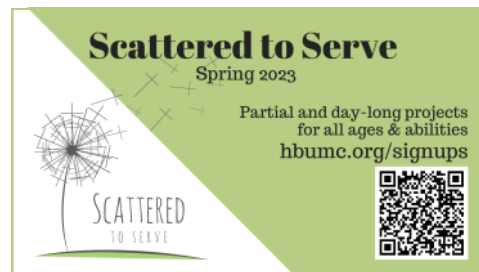
