Won't You Be A Neighbor? Outreach @ Hayes Barton UMC

If you look closely at the parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke chapter 10, you will notice something. A lawyer, in a conversation with Jesus, asks him, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus answers the lawyer's question with the story of the Good Samaritan. After telling the parable, Jesus asks, "Which of these three, do you think, *was a neighbor* to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?"

Did you catch it? Jesus turned the lawyer's question of "Who is my neighbor?" into asking "Who *was a neighbor*?" This reveals to us that Jesus is less interested in a philosophical discussion about who we should be helping and is more interested in making sure we are helping those in need, that *we are being the neighbor*. (Mark Gornik. *To Live in Peace: Biblical Faith and the Changing Inner City*. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans Publishing, 2002. 8-9.)

During these first five months of 2022, many members of HBUMC have given themselves in service to our neighbors.

- ✦ A team of church members continues to work with Hayes Barton Baptist Church and Welcome House in caring for refugee families moving to Raleigh from around the world.
- ✦ Our church has served meals at the Helen Wright Center (a shelter for women) and at Oak City Cares (a hub for those experiencing homelessness just south of downtown).
- ✦ Church members adopted 71 residents of Parkview Manor, a 55+ residential community for Raleigh residents living below the median income, to shower them with loving gifts and a caring relationship.
- ✦ As a church, we donated about 1,800 lbs. of items to Feed the Pack throughout Lent. Our NCSU college students and faculty members delivered these items each week.
- ✦ Church members continue to volunteer with Southeast Raleigh Elementary school providing in-class teacher support and working with Southeast Raleigh Promise through a teaching garden at the school.
- ✦ Our preschool and children's ministry participated in Scattered to Serve by making notes for the nurses, staff, and doctors of Transitions LifeCare and restocking their break room with snacks.



- ✦ Through our Pastor's Discretionary Fund, approximately \$7,000 has been distributed to local families to help them with rent, utility bills, or buying clothes and groceries for their families.

- ✦ Fifteen projects were organized for our spring Scattered to Serve season involving over 150 members in active service.



- ✦ In April, our United Methodist Women distributed \$52,000 in 2021 Humble Heart Bazaar proceeds to local organizations and agencies supporting women's/children's needs.
- ✦ Our United Methodist Men raised money for Wee Care and the Methodist Home for Children through their spring Chicken Dinner Fundraiser.

Let us celebrate and give God thanks for all the ways that we as a church have been a neighbor to those experiencing a season of need.

In the months to come, we will continue to be a church answering Jesus's call for his disciples *to be a neighbor*. Here are just a few of the upcoming Outreach opportunities:

- ✦ May 15 – Fill the Van @ Worship in the Park! – Bring pantry items for the Taylor-Burroughs Marketplace supporting the Alliance for AIDS Service of NC. A full list of items can be found at hbumc.org/signups
- ✦ In June, our youth will go on an Appalachia Service Project trip and in August will participate in SLAM Raleigh.
- ✦ We will continue our many relationships with local organizations and agencies such as Oak City Cares (homeless support), Welcome House (refugee support), Helen Wright Center (for women), the Women's Center, Parkview Manor, Wilson Temple UMC Food Pantry, Neighbor to Neighbor, and more!

May Is Mental Health Awareness Month

Did you know that May is Mental Health Awareness month? The pastors and some lay members at HBUMC recognize that the pandemic has put strains on everybody's mental health. For many who already experience mental health problems, the pandemic multiplied the effects. For others, new issues began to emerge. Anxiety, depression, OCD, thoughts of suicide, and general feelings of hopelessness are a few of the symptoms heard by pastors and congregation alike. In a sense, it has become a pandemic of its own. Following Galatians 6:10, "So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith," a series of programs about Mental Health have been developed and are being offered to our congregation and the local community. HBUMC recognizes that one type of program does not speak to all. We want to reach all of our members, from preschool age to our senior citizens, in different ways and meet everyone where they are at.

Some programs we have offered thus far are the Bedlam: An Intimate Journey Into America's Mental Health Crisis and The Wisdom of Your Body book studies; Youth Mental Health First-Aid Training; a retreat at St. Francis Springs; the Youth Beach Retreat - Breathing Under Water; speaker Dr. Rachel Porter on Eating Disorders and preschool parent workshops with Pediatric Therapy Associates. In addition, our pastors and Stephen Ministers have spent countless hours listening and offering compassion to those going through struggles.
