

From Pastor Matt: Come and See HBUMC's Outreach

At the beginning of 2023, I reflected on HBUMC's Outreach ministries in 2022, and I looked forward to the Outreach work our church will do this year. In my reflections, my mind kept returning to John 1:35-39:

The next day John [the Baptist] again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon.

In particular, I kept hearing Jesus's invitation words "come and see" echo in my mind. Jesus's words are my prayer for our congregational Outreach this year: I pray that we will "come and see" the missional work that God is doing in our own community and in the world. I pray that we, like the disciples, will seek out the places where the Lamb of God is residing and "remain with him" there. When we listen to where Jesus is leading us, when we go to see the work that Jesus is about and bring an open spirit with us, then we never know how our lives and the world might be changed.

Below is a list of various previous, current, or upcoming Outreach activities. As you can see, HBUMC's Outreach is vibrant and actively engaged in our community. Being with those in need and building meaningful relationships is our constant aim.

Previous:

- Pastor Daniel and twenty youth from Iglesia Cristiana came to learn Pickleball in Casper Holroyd Hall (see photo-right)
- John Drescher and Bob Seligson traveled to Rwanda to visit longtime international mission partner ZOE Empowers (see

photo-below)



- Several members participated in the Habitat build kickoff and wall build on January 28
- \$3,772.05 donated to Overflowing Hands from Generous Helping meal donations
- \$9,783 given to Doorstep Ministry at Edenton Street (for rent/utility assistance) from Holiday Share and Christmas Eve offering
- \$5,993.50 from Christmas Eve offering sent to UMCOR-Ukrainian Crisis Relief
- In 2022, our Pastor's Discretionary Fund disbursed \$46,850.80 primarily to assist individuals with rent/utilities/basic needs. \$23,000 of this went directly to Edenton Street UMC's Doorstep Ministry and the Friendship Fund at First Presbyterian Church
- Hearts and Hands for Haiti: Pastor Sadrac Christian, who HBUMC has supported, recently graduated from seminary.

Current/Ongoing:

- Church-wide Lenten collection for Feed the Pack
- Youth JOY Class providing weekend food bags for Wee Care students
- Fifth Saturday breakfasts served at Oak City Cares
- Secret Pals ministry at Parkview Manor
- Mentoring with Neighbor to Neighbor/Iglesia Cristiana at Millbrook UMC



- Prep has begun in the SE Raleigh Elem School garden, which is used as a teaching garden for the school children and provides fresh vegetables to residents of Beacon Ridge Apartments
- Small groups/Sunday Schools providing meals to the Helen Wright Center
- Regular volunteers from our congregation at Meals on Wheels, A Place at the Table, StepUp Ministries, Saint Saviour's Center, The Women's Center, Neighbor to Neighbor/Seeds of Hope, Soroptimist, Alliance Medical Ministry, Raleigh Boys & Girls Club, Alliance for Aids Ministry, and more!

Upcoming:

- A community dinner with refugee families and Refugee Hope Partners planned for March 20
- Habitat Builds scheduled for March 25, April 22, and May 20
- Seven weeks of Scattered to Serve projects from March 25-May 7
- The Biblical Justice Action Team is partnering with RAFI's Farm and Faith Partnership to support local farmers of color (learn more inside)
- HBUMC's refugee ministries received a \$2,000 Mustard Seed grant from the UMC to help provide local refugee families with swimming lessons this summer
- Several volunteers from HBUMC will soon be going twice a month to Edenton Street UMC to assist in their Doorstep ministry which provides financial assistance and community referrals to those in need.

Thanks be to God for all these expressions of Christ's love in our community! I pray that you find a place to "come and see" God's work in our community and that you will remain there long enough to notice the Lamb of God's transformative presence.

A Day Apart Retreats at Cedar Cross

Cedar Cross Retreat Center in Louisburg, NC is hosting A Day Apart after a three-year hiatus due to the pandemic. These gatherings take place on the fourth Monday of each month from 9:30am-3pm. March's retreat will be on March 27.

A Day Apart begins with a brief time of worship, followed by the introduction of quotes from a writer, then folks have silence until regathering just before lunch for a time to share about their respective experiences, if so led. After lunch, more quotes are introduced before a time of silence. At 2:30, there is a time to share experiences and take Communion.

During the silence, participants are welcome to do as they are led. Some folks find a quiet place -- either inside or outside -- to reflect on one of the quotes or something else. Some walk the trails, or the labyrinth, or the meditation trail called the Way of Jesus.
