

From Pastor Matt

My family does not face hunger. My children do not go off to school, and I do not go to work, on an empty stomach. None of us go to bed hungry. Not only that, but on any given day we have extra food in our pantry and refrigerator. I am aware of, and grateful for, our abundance.

I am also aware that many of our neighbors in North Carolina struggle to have enough to eat. Sometimes I wonder: When I live with extra food, why should others not have enough?

Here are some quick facts on hunger in North Carolina from feedingamerica.org and foodshuttle.org:

- In 2021, almost **1.5 million** North Carolinians regularly face hunger.
- This includes over **400,000**, or **1 in 5**, children.
- North Carolina is the **10th** hungriest state in the nation.
- Food insecurity significantly increases the risk of developing chronic illnesses.
- Hunger negatively impacts school performance and the likelihood of high school graduation.

I give God thanks that our church is actively engaged in the work of feeding the hungry. Through financial support, various food collections throughout the year, and active volunteers working throughout our community, we are engaging the issue of food insecurity. Yet, more opportunities for participation exist. For example, on the second Friday morning of the

month, HBUMC church members deliver meals for Meals on Wheels. Currently, more drivers are needed on those Fridays and other days of the week as well. For more information about getting involved, please contact Jane Holding by email at janeholding1@gmail.com.

Another opportunity to participate in closing the hunger gap is through our Thanksgiving Food Box ministry. As we prepare our own Thanksgiving feasts for our families, consider those families who cannot afford an abundant Thanksgiving meal. Consider that with schools closed for three days of Thanksgiving week, many children in our immediate area may need meals.

Our Thanksgiving Food Box ministry sign up is currently posted on the church website at hbumc.org/signups. I invite you to participate by (1) praying about food insecurity in North Carolina, (2) donating toward our Thanksgiving Food Box collection, and (3) participating in sorting, packing, and/or delivering the boxes. Together, we can make a difference this Thanksgiving season.
