In 2018, the leaders of the GLLC reframed the mission of the organization to focus on taking coordinated regional action to assure that the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River continue to provide a plentiful source of clean, affordable water for the region's residents, businesses, and industries. To carry out this mission, the GLLC organizes committees and task forces as needed to focus on specific issues on the GLLC's policy agenda. The following committees are or will be active in 2019-2020. Executive Committee (elected positions)

The GLLC Executive Committee directs and oversees the work of the Caucus. This bipartisan committee is made up of one elected representative from each of the 10 jurisdictions in the region as well as the elected officers of the Caucus (chair and vice chair). Past GLLC chairs and the chairs of any committees or task forces serve as ex officio members of the Executive Committee. Caucus officers and Executive Committee members are elected every two years at the GLLC Annual Meeting; the next election will take place in September 2020. Candidates for officer positions must have served previously as members of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee holds conference calls as needed and currently holds one meeting in conjunction with the GLLC Annual Meeting.

Task Force on Lead

The Task Force on Lead drives the Caucus's work on lead in drinking water. Organized in September 2018, the task force has produced a GLLC resolution, action plan, and model policy on reducing exposure to lead in drinking water. The task force will continue its work in 2020 with a focus on financing the full replacement of lead service lines, reviewing and commenting on the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Lead and Copper Rule revisions, and refining and working to enact the GLLC's model policy on lead in drinking water. The task force will hold 3-4 conference calls in late 2019 through the end of 2020.

Task Force on Nutrients

New in 2019, the Task Force on Nutrients will spearhead the GLLC's efforts to take coordinated regional action to reduce nutrient pollution that leads to the formation of harmful algal blooms in the Great Lakes, St. Lawrence River, and other waterbodies. Most of the task force members participated in the inaugural Birkholz Institute in late 2019. To achieve the goal of having representation from all 10 jurisdictions in the region, the task force is seeking at least two members from New York. GLLC members from other jurisdictions also are encouraged to join. The task force will hold conference calls periodically starting in late 2019 and continuing into 2021. The members also will hold a workshop in August or September 2020 to evaluate progress in implementing the GLLC's action plan.
